Kids ages 16 and younger are invited to Parks and Recreation's fall fishing event. Prizes will be awarded by age divisions (1-6, 7-11, 12-16) in the following categories: biggest fish, smallest fish and most fish caught. Anglers are encouraged to bring their own gear and bait. The lake will be stocked with catfish, but the waters are also home to other species. A limited number of loaner rods and reels will be available on a first-come basis—while the supply lasts. While the event is free and no pre-registration is required, Parks and Recreation staff will be on hand to register kids in order for them to be eligible for prizes at the end of the event. Adults, or anyone 7 years or older, is welcome to fish after 2 p.m., or any day after the event providing they have a valid Texas fishing license.

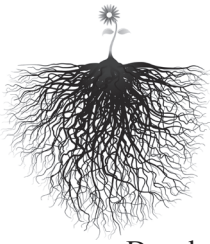

PROTECT AGAINST MOSQUITO BITES

Mosquito season in the Dallas-Fort Worth area typically runs from May to October, with peak activity in August. Defend yourself from West Nile Virus by using the 3Ds:

Deet

Use insect repellents that contain DEET or any other EPA approved insect repellent.

Dress

Wear long, loose and light-colored clothing outside during dusk and dawn hours.

Drain

Remove all areas of standing water. Change water in wading pools, pet dishes and birdbaths several times a week.

AFTER-SCHOOL PROGRAM

The After-School program is a five-day-a-week program during the



school year that provides your child, ages 5-12, with homework time, a snack and recreation. Staff from Charley Taylor Recreation Center, 610 E. Grand Prairie Road, pick up from nearby Lee Elementary and offer van pick-ups from Bowie, Crockett and Williams. Children will be provided with snack, homework help, organized games, crafts, movies, computers and more. Payment is due weekly. Pickup will begin once liability form, membership fee, and first week fee is paid. The fee is \$20 per week for Lee Elementary School and \$30 per week for Bowie, Crockett and Williams. FLOOD-RELATED ISSUES

Drainage System Maintenance

It is illegal in the City of Grand Prairie to dump any type of debris into a canal, stream, river or drainage ditch. This debris can become entangled in culverts and shallow streambeds, canals or drainage ditches and impede drainage causing the flow of water to back up. Citizens of Grand Prairie should also keep drainage ditches on their property free of debris, foliage and vegetation that would impede the flow of water. Debris dumping should be reported to the City of Grand Prairie city's Public Works Department at 972-237-8154.

Flood Information

Citizens of the City of Grand Prairie can obtain flood information concerning flooding, flood maps, mandatory flood insurance purchase requirements, flood insurance requirements and inquiries, and flood zone determinations from the City of Grand Prairie's Engineering Department located at the Development Center or by calling 972-237-8141.

Elevation Certificates of all properties in the Special Flood Hazard Areas (SFHA's) are available and on file at the Office of the Engineering Department and copies are available upon request.

Flood Protection Assistance

Concerned citizens and the general public can obtain information on flood protection assistance from the City of Grand Prairie's Office of Planning and Development or the Engineering Department by calling 972-237-8255 or 972-237-8141. Flood protection assistance provided by the City of Grand Prairie is site-specific flood and flood related data, data on historical flooding in the neighborhood and similar information so inquirers can relate the flood threat to their problems.

List of Services Provided:

1. Provide a list of names of contractors and consultants knowledgeable or experienced in retrofitting techniques and construction.
2. Provide materials or how to select a qualified contractor and what recourse citizens have if they are dissatisfied with the contractor's performance.
3. Make site visits to review flooding, drainage and sewer problems and provide one-on-one advice to property owners.
4. Provide advice and assistance on retrofitting techniques, such as elevating buildings above flood levels or the Base Flood Elevation (BFE), dry floodproofing, wet floodproofing and protecting basements from sewer backup. Also, information on the installation of barriers, levees, and flood walls around individual buildings or structures is available.

GP POLICE DEPT. KICKS OFF NEW ACADEMY

For the first time ever, the city of Grand Prairie Police Department is conducting its own Police Academy for police recruits. Previously, the city sent its new police hires to regional police academies, which do an excellent job. However, operating its own police academy allows the Grand Prairie Police Department to observe its police recruits on a daily basis during their 28-week academy and facilitates an 8-week Lateral Police Academy for experienced officers. Operating an in-house academy is cost effective for the city and allows police recruits to become more indoctrinated and knowledgeable regarding the city of Grand Prairie in their first weeks of employment.

HOUSEHOLD HAZ WASTE DISPOSAL

Paint is by far the most common item brought to our household hazardous waste (HHW) collection events. Remember, you can dispose of latex (water-based) paint by taking the lid off, letting it dry completely, and placing it in your trash. Oil-based paints and solvents should be brought to a collection event or taken to the Environmental Collection Center in Fort Worth.

Along with proper disposal, one of the most important things you can do is to reduce the amount of paint waste you generate.

Our next HHW events will be **Saturday, Sept. 8,** and **Saturday, Oct. 13,** from 9-11 a.m. at the Development Center located at 206 West Church St. We will accept household and automotive batteries, pharmaceuticals, motor oil, cooking oil, paint, aerosol cans, fluorescent bulbs, and household, landscape, and pool chemicals. We will **not** accept explosives, gas cylinders, fireworks, medical waste, radioactive materials, or municipal trash. **No commercial waste** will be accepted.
