FIRE ISO RATING

Grand Prairie homeowners and local business owners may qualify to receive a lower insurance renewal rate as a result of the ISO 1 rating score earned by the Grand Prairie Fire Department.

As of April 2017, the City joins the top 1 percent of communities in the US for excellence in fire protection. Only 1 in 33 cities in Texas have received an ISO 1 rating.

"This is a citywide accomplishment," says Grand Prairie Fire Chief Robert Fite. "It takes a collaborative effort between all city departments, and support from our City Council, to earn a perfect rating. I especially commend our staff for their dedication and commitment to provide the citizens of Grand Prairie superior property fire protection."

SENIOR SAFETY KEY LOCKBOX PROGRAM

In an effort to quickly respond to our senior citizens who might need immediate attention in the event of a medical emergency, the Grand Prairie Police Department has fully implemented the Senior Safety Key Lockbox Program. To qualify, the senior adult should be age 65 or older living alone or often left alone; or a resident younger than 65 with a major medical issue that could render them incapacitated or unconscious may also be considered. The key lockbox, installed by a qualified volunteer, securely provides a door key so emergency first responders can enter a home when the resident is not able to answer the door due to a medical or other emergency, thus reducing the need of using forced entry to render aid. At the time of installation, a spare key will be placed in the lockbox and the unique opening code will be set. The GPPD will give the code to 911 Communications so the key may be accessible to first responders.
