**WEST NILE VIRUS MOSQUITO SAMPLE REPORTED  
GRAND PRAIRIE TO GROUND SPRAY WEDNESDAY AND THURSDAY**

GRAND PRAIRIE—The City of Grand Prairie reports one West Nile Virus positive mosquito sample and will ground spray for two nights on Wednesday, Sept. 19, and Thursday, Sept. 20, depending on weather conditions, starting at 9 p.m. This area is bound by W. Trinity Boulevard on the north, Hardrock Road on the east, W. Oakdale Road on the south, and Roy Orr Boulevard on the west.

Residents in this area are advised to stay indoors, keep pets inside, and cover fish ponds during those times. Spraying will be rescheduled if wind speeds are above 10 mph or in the event of rain. A map of this area is available at [www.gptx.org](http://www.gptx.org).
