**WEST NILE VIRUS POSITIVE MOSQUITO SAMPLE REPORTED  
GRAND PRAIRIE TO GROUND SPRAY WEDNESDAY AND THURSDAY**

GRAND PRAIRIE—The City of Grand Prairie reports one West Nile Virus positive mosquito sample and will ground spray the following area for two nights on Wednesday, June 26, and Thursday, June 27, depending on weather conditions, starting at 9 p.m. The area is bound by Beatty Drive and Kirby Creek Drive on the north, Corn Valley Road on the east, S Carrier Parkway and Corn Valley Road on the south, and S Carrier Parkway on the west.

Residents in this area are advised to stay indoors, keep pets inside, and cover fish ponds during those times. Spraying will be rescheduled if wind speeds are above 10 mph or in the event of rain. A map of this area is available at [www.gptx.org](http://www.gptx.org).
