

Grand Prairie City Council Member Kurt Johnson Appointed to the NLC's Finance, Administration and Intergovernmental Relations Federal Advocacy Committee

Grand Prairie, Texas — Kurt Johnson, member of the Grand Prairie, Texas City Council, has been appointed to the National League of Cities (NLC) 2025 Finance, Administration and Intergovernmental Relations (FAIR) Federal Advocacy Committee.

Johnson is the first elected official from the City of Grand Prairie appointed to this committee.

Johnson was elected to a one-year term and will provide strategic direction and guidance for NLC's federal advocacy agenda and policy priorities on municipal finance and intergovernmental relations with the federal government.

The appointment was announced by NLC President Steve Patterson, Mayor of Athens, Ohio.
