

They are required to notify neighbors within 200 feet of the property that they intend to rent out the property and they are required to post a phone number for a 24 hour contact.



COMMUNITY CATS - TNR PROGRAM

To humanely decrease the stray cat population, Grand Prairie Animal Services and volunteers coordinate a free community cat fix program called Trap-Neuter-Return (TNR).

The TNR program involves (1) trapping all or most of the cats in a colony, (2) getting them sterilized and (3) releasing them. Cats returned to the community are tipped on the left ear to identify them as sterilized.

Once fixed, these cats are better neighbors. They are not as likely to engage in problem behaviors like yowling,

fighting, or spraying. Best of all, they will not be reproducing and increasing the number of homeless cats.

TNR is supported by numerous cities and counties as the only proven way to effectively control feral cat population growth

If you find a cat that is alone, has a shiny coat, and seems well fed, it most likely belongs to one of your neighbors. Cats are very good at finding their way home and will eventually make their way back. There is no law in Grand Prairie against free-roaming cats, so please leave stray cats where you found them. COMMUNITY RATING SYSTEM AND FLOOD ASSISTANCE INFORMATION

The City of Grand Prairie participates in the Community Rating System (CRS). The CRS is a subset of the National Flood Insurance Program (NFIP). This voluntary incentive program recognizes and encourages community floodplain management activities that exceed the minimum NFIP requirements. As a result, flood insurance premium rates are discounted to reflect the reduced flood risk resulting from the community's actions meeting the three goals of the CRS: 1) Reduce flood losses, 2) Facilitate accurate insurance rating, and 3) Promote the awareness of flood insurance. Community participation in the CRS is in addition to participation in the NFIP. Participation in the NFIP does not automatically include participation in the CRS. The city just went through a 5-year verification of its CRS program activities and as of June 2022, the City of Grand Prairie has a CRS ranking of 5, which qualifies residents for a 25% discount on flood insurance premiums for properties located in the 1% annual chance floodplain, or Special Flood Hazard Area (SFHA). The city's Stormwater department provides a comprehensive flood information program to residents which helps the city meet the 3 goals of the CRS program. Residents may access flood risk and assistance information by visiting the city's Stormwater Department and meeting with a department representative in person, by phone at 972-237-8321, or the city's website at www.gptx.org/floodplain.

EXTREME HEAT SAFETY

There is hot, and then there is hot! Extreme heat is a period of high heat and humidity with temperatures above 90 degrees for at least two to three days. In extreme heat your body works extra hard to maintain a



normal temperature, which can lead to death. Extreme heat is responsible for the highest number of annual deaths among all weather-related hazards. Remember:

- Older adults, children, and sick or overweight individuals are at greater risk from extreme heat
- Humidity increases the feeling of heat
- Drink plenty of fluids to stay hydrated
- Take cool showers or baths
- Never leave people or pets in a closed car on a hot day
- If you're outside, find shade and wear a hat to protect your face
