

MEN'S CRICKET T20 WORLD CUP IN GP

Grand Prairie will host cricket fans from around the globe this summer as one of the cities hosting the ICC Men's T20 World Cup. This is the first Cricket World Cup held in North America and the marquee opening match of the tournament will be in Grand Prairie Stadium, 1600 Lone Star Parkway, on Saturday, June 1 with the United States facing Canada. To accommodate these games, an additional



6,000 seats will be added to Grand Prairie Stadium this summer.

- Netherlands vs. Nepal Tuesday, June 4
- United States vs. Pakistan Thursday, June 6

New HISTORY BOOKS FOR SALE

The History of the African American Experience and Perspective in Grand Prairie

A new Grand Prairie history book is now available for purchase for \$35. The book examines the history of the African American experience and perspective from 1852-2023. Commissioned by the City of Grand Prairie, author Warren Landrum combined research, historical documents, and interviews to craft the story from the first African American to arrive in Grand Prairie, Mose Jordan in 1952 through the decades to today.

The history of Grand Prairie has been documented in two previous books. Still, neither includes much about the African American experience which was not traditionally covered in mainstream media in the 1800s-mid 1900s. Grand Prairie was fortunate to have two of the first freedmen communities following the Emancipation Proclamation in Bear Creek and Freetown, with Dalworth following the turn of the century. Many of the ancestors of those founding families still live in town today. Through interviews, questionnaires, excerpts from historic *It Happened in Grand Prairie* videos, and news articles, the author was able to craft the chronology of the African American experience in Grand Prairie, which is presented in this new book.

GRASS HEIGHT MAXIMUM: 10 INCHES

The maximum height for grass in Grand Prairie is 10 inches. It is unlawful for any person with ownership in a property in the City of Grand Prairie to have grass, weeds, rubbish or brush at a height greater than 10 inches, or for property to appear unsightly or unsanitary along, upon or across the sidewalk or street. Seven days after a property owner has been given notification of high grass, Code Compliance will issue citations and may have the property mowed. The resident will be billed and charged a \$150 administrative fee.

LAWN CARE - DON'T BAG IT!

As we return to spring and the promise of green lawns, the immediate thought might be, "What do I do with the grass clippings I will be collecting?" The short answer is don't collect it! By leaving the clippings on the lawn and allowing them to work their way back into the soil, you will help produce a naturally good looking lawn. There is no need for chemical fertilizers if done consistently. The rule of thumb is not to remove more than one-third of the leaf surface at any one time. For example; common Bermuda grass when $2-\frac{1}{4}$ " or less, should be mowed at a setting of $1-\frac{1}{2}$ ".

If your lawn has started sprouting weeds already, apply the mowing principles mentioned, and bag the weeds and grass clippings collected for your compost pile, as this is rich in nitrogen and is an essential component of composting. The composted material in turn provides a valuable natural soil amendment that can be used in your garden and also on your lawn as needed to reduce weeds. This continuous cycle provides an effective way to manage your yard waste. FIRE DEPT. ACHIEVES ISO#1 RATING AGAIN

The City of Grand Prairie Fire Department received ISO#1 rating again this year. Grand Prairie is one of three cities in the entire state that have held this status of ISO#1 and the American Heart Gold Plus Award for eight years. This equates to insurance savings and superior customer service for residents. The renewal of this ISO#1 status this year means that residents will continue to enjoy savings in insurance rates for the next seven to 10 years. WILDFIRE SAFETY

Wildfires are unplanned fires that burn in natural areas like forests, grasslands, or prairies. These dangerous fires spread quickly and can devastate not only wildlife and natural areas, but also communities.

Safety tips:

- Signup for AlertGP to receive realtime emergency alerts during an emergency at gptx.org/alertGP
- Make sure everyone in your household knows and understands what to do if you need to evacuate quickly.
- Have enough supplies for your household, including a first aid kit, ready for emergencies.
- You may have to evacuate quickly due to a wildfire. Learn your evacuation routes, practice with your household and pets, and identify where you will go.

During a fire:

- Pay attention to emergency alerts and notifications for information and instructions.
- Evacuate immediately if authorities tell you to do so!
- Do not return home until authorities say it is safe to do so.
