LIGHTS OUT TEXAS


Did you know 1 out of every 3 birds migrating through the U.S. passes through Texas? Most migratory birds fly at night, meaning the bright lights of com



the bright lights of commercial and residential buildings attract and disorient birds. This distraction can cause collisions and leave birds vulnerable to threats on the ground.


Reservations open online at 6 a.m. or at 9 a.m. in-person/over the phone two business days in advance. Reservations are for one-hour minimum, two hours maximum.

FLOOD SAFETY IN GRAND PRAIRIE: WHAT YOU NEED TO KNOW

Flooding can happen quickly, especially during periods of heavy rain, and the City of Grand Prairie takes steps to keep residents informed and out of harm's way. One of the most important tools the city uses is its Flood Warning System (FWS). This system tracks rising water levels at key creeks and drainage channels throughout Grand Prairie and shares real-time updates that help emergency responders take action before situations worsen.

Residents can also access this real-time data for themselves by visiting gptx. onerain.com. It's a great way to stay in the loop during stormy weather.

Knowing the difference between a flood watch and a flood warning can also make a big difference in how you respond:

- A flood watch means that conditions are favorable for flooding. Stay alert, especially if you live in a flood-prone area.
- A flood warning means flooding is either happening now or expected very soon. If you're in the affected area, move to higher ground right away.

If you ever come across floodwaters, whether on foot or in a vehicle, do not try to cross. Just a small amount of fast-moving water can be dangerous. Remember the phrase: Turn Around, Don't Drown!

Staying informed is the first step to staying safe. Take time to prepare, keep an eye on weather alerts, and help us protect Grand Prairie—one storm at a time.

EXTREME HEAT AWARENESS

Extreme heat is a period of high heat and humidity with temperatures above 90 degrees for at least two to three days. In extreme heat your body works extra hard to maintain a normal temperature, which can lead to death.

Remember:

- Extreme heat can occur quickly and without warning.
- · Older adults, children, and sick or overweight individuals are at greater risk from extreme heat.
- Humidity increases the feeling of heat as measured by a heat index.

Stay in the shade or indoors during extreme heat!
