



BANNERS FOR COMMERCIAL PROPERTIES ONLY

All banners require a free 30-day permit prior to placing on building. Each business is allowed ONE banner with a permit and must be attached to the front facade of the building. Banners may not be used as permanent signage for a business; they may not hang from an awning, be tied between poles or placed on vehicles in front of the business. 

FLOOD SAFETY



Flooding is a temporary overflow of water onto land that is normally dry. It is the most common natural disaster in the U.S. Here are some quick tips to practice flood safety for the upcoming rainy season:

- Evacuate when advised by authorities or if you are in a flood or flash flood-prone area.
- Never drive or walk through flooded streets; water can be deceivingly shallow.
- Six inches of water will reach the bottom of most passenger cars causing loss of control and possible stalling.
