





We've all forgotten something – Don't forget someone.

Over the past 25 years, more than 950 children have died of heatstroke. Never leave a child in a vehicle unattended for any length of time.

Rolling windows down or parking in the shade does little to change the interior temperature of the vehicle. If you see a child alone in a locked car, act immediately and call 911. A child in distress due to heat should be removed from the vehicle as quickly as possible and rapidly cooled.
