Belt Line Road Construction

The Texas Department of Transportation will begin construction on Belt Line Road (FM 1382) from Main St (HWY 180) to Interstate 20 on Aug. 6, 2023.

Crews will work at night from 7 p.m. until 5 a.m., Sunday through Thursday until the end of October 2023.

Construction will include asphalt replacement, surface treatment, and full-depth concrete repairs on Belt Line, starting at the northern end of the project.

Beginning in November, 2023, they will move to bridge repair, chevrons, and guardrail replacement during the days through the end of February 2024. Expect delays.

Message from the Manager


