Pump Station to Provide Water for Far South GP

City officials, representatives from Freese & Nichols, Inc. and Felix Construction recently celebrated completion of the Heritage Pump Station near Highway 287 and SH 360. The newly completed pump station will meet water needs in Grand Prairie's largest residential growth area along Highway 287. It will initially serve 623 households and eventually provide water for approximately 26,665 homes. Capable of providing 6 million gallons of water per day (MGD) the pump station is expandable to 12 MGD. The ground storage tank holds water equivalent to three Olympic-sized swimming pools. The pump station will begin operating in early 2024.

Sleep for Good Health

Only roughly 1 percent of us can function when regularly getting five or six hours. For everyone else, "seven or eight hours of sleep is recommended for optimal health and functioning," says Michael Scullin, Ph.D., an associate professor of psychology and neuroscience at Baylor University. Routinely getting less is linked to higher risk for obesity, diabetes, high blood pressure, and memory problems. When people who are sleeping less than seven to eight hours start getting that recommended amount, "we often see their well-being increase," he says.
