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On May 2, 2026, Grand Prairie voters will decide on a proposed General Obligation (GO) Bond Program totaling \$327 million.

Proposition A Streets & Infrastructure

Will fund nonresidential street improvement projects throughout the city.

\$209.5 Million

Proposition B Public Safety

Will fund public safety resource center in the southern part of the city and upgrade other existing public safety assets throughout the city.

Proposition C Parks & Recreational Facilities

Will fund park and recreational facilities, including a community/multi-purpose center, pickleball complex, public artwork and a botanical garden.

How will the Bond Affect Taxes?

If approved, the bond is estimated to increase the debt service tax rate by 3.9 cents per \$100 of taxable value. For example, a homeowner under age 65 with a home taxable value of \$300,000 would see an estimated annual increase of \$117, or about \$9.75 per month.

No Tax Increase for Homeowners 65+ with a Tax Freeze

Homeowners age 65 or older who already qualify for the tax freeze would not be impacted by this tax increase. However, the frozen tax amount may change if the homeowner makes certain improvements to the property.

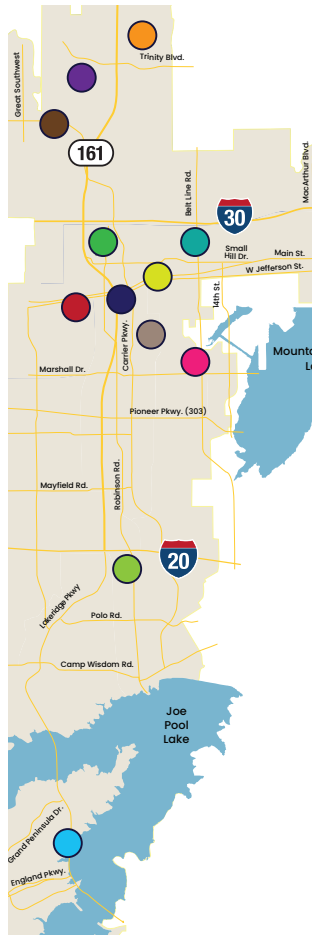
