






TOP 10 ACCOMPLISHMENTS OF 2007

Completed renovation of Uptown Theater exterior, and began interior design of the \$3.5 million project to transform the former movie house into a fine arts center in 2009.

Built a new home every 8 hours, issuing permits for 1,158 homes, and \$133 million in commercial/industrial space.

Paid off the debt to build Lone Star Park 18 years early, which allowed citizens to pass a 1/4 cent sales tax for a new Police Headquarters, a 1/8 cent sales tax for a new Senior Center and a 1/8 cent sales tax for a new minor league baseball stadium.

Welcomed Lake Prairie Town Center, a power center at Camp Wisdom and


SH-360 featuring Super Target, Home Depot and 24 Hour Fitness.




