FALLEN LOG HEART ART PROJECT

The city of Grand Prairie's Fallen Log heART art project installation is now installed in Waggoner Park, 2122 N. Carrier Parkway, perfect for your family, friends or individual photo. Located under a tree canopy, with a natural backdrop of vines and foliage, just north of the walking trail behind the ballfields, the



artwork replicates a tree that fell in the forest just waiting to be discovered. With a heart shaped "LOVE" carved into the trunk, the 12-foot log has enough room for sitting, standing, stacking...even laying for a dramatic pose for you and your loved ones. The tree was handcrafted by the artisans at NatureMaker Steel Art Trees. Fallen Log is the second installation of the heART Art Project, the first being murals at Farmers Market, which will rotate periodically during the year. The heART Art Project is the brainchild of Councilwoman Jorja Clemson who envisioned art using hearts to symbolize and communicate and inspire love, kindness and unity throughout town. The city will issue a Call to Artists for a third installation in 2022.

FLOOD SIREN INFORMATION, DISASTER PREPAREDNESS AND FLOOD SAFETY TIPS



Did you know Grand Prairie has three flood warning sirens, specifically for flood emergencies in the city? During the floods of May 2015, Grand Prairie received more than 20 inches of rain in less than one month. In fact, in that flooding event alone, the state of Texas received enough rain to cover the entire state with eight inches of water.

The three flood warning sirens cover parts of the city that are vulnerable to flash flooding incidents. When activated, the flood sirens transmit a voice message, tone alerts and give information about what residents in the affected area should do during the flood event. The Grand Prairie Office of Emergency Management determines if the sirens should be activated based on automated alerts sent by the stream sensors at these locations which are controlled by the city's Flood Warning System.

These flood sirens are just another tool the City has in its tool bag to help protect residents from natural hazards. Did you know that according to the Texas Flood Insurance Group, flash flooding is the #1 natural hazard threat to Texas residents? Below are some emergency preparedness tips that you can follow to help prepare for hazards in Grand Prairie:

- Build an emergency kit to stay safe, fed, and comfortable after a disaster Include water, non-perishable foods, first aid kit and batteries
- Make an evacuation plan to include pets in case of an emergency
 - Determine who you will contact, where you will meet and practice the plan
- Keep important documents in a safe and waterproof place
- Itemize and take pictures of possessions
- Purchase Renters' insurance (if you rent a property) and flood insurance
- Become familiar with your policies and make sure limits protect your property and personal belongs
