#### **New Development**

Braum's plans to open a new 6,000-square-foot store on the north side of Camp Wisdom, east of Magna Carta. Dutch Bros. Coffee Shop will open on southbound SH 161 just south of Warrior Trail. Bahama Bucks will open a store on the southeast corner of Forum Dr. and SH 161 with menu items such as shaved ice snow cones, fruit smoothies, acai bowls and iced coffees.



The Epic Central development is on track to become a destination hub for entertainment, the arts, recreation and food. **Chicken N' Pickle** restaurant and entertainment venue will open in December 2021. Epic Central's waterfront restaurants, **Vidorra, Stirr, Serious Eats** and **Loop 9 Barbecue** are scheduled to open in late summer 2022. Epic Central is part of the \$75 million Economic Development Bond Proposal approved by voters in May 2021.



#### FLOOD INSURANCE LETTER FROM THE MAYOR

#### Dear Resident,

A flood can devastate your home and your financial stability. Any flood – even a small one – can result in expensive repairs. Floodwaters are a mixture of mud, sewage, animal waste and chemicals. Floods ruin floors, walls and carpets. Everything from appliances to your furniture may have to be thrown away. You have seen the pictures of household items thrown to the curb following the recent, devastating flood events in Texas.

Without flood insurance, you are on your own. Your standard homeowner's insurance policy does not cover flood damages. The government will not help you pay for necessary repairs following a flood. The President must declare a flood a disaster before federal assistance can be made available. Even when floods are declared disasters, financial assistance is typically provided in the form of a loan that you will have to pay back with interest.

Flooding is America's #1 disaster. You don't have to live near a major creek or waterway to be flooded. Severe storms, downed trees, and debris dumped in creeks can all cause flooding. The good news is that flood insurance can be surprisingly affordable. If you live in a moderate-to-low risk area, the typical flood insurance policy costs approximately \$350 a year for building and contents coverage. If you rent and do not own your home, you can purchase 'contents only' coverage to protect your belongings.

Anyone in the City of Grand Prairie can purchase flood insurance. You do not have to live in the 1% annual chance (100-year) floodplain to purchase flood insurance. The majority of the private property flood damages reported to the City in 2015 were located outside the 1% annual chance floodplain.

Floods can happen in a short period of time. Flash flooding can happen with very little warning. FEMA typically has a 30-day waiting period before flood insurance becomes effective. If you wait until a flood is predicted, you may not be able to get flood insurance coverage in advance of the storm.

The City's Stormwater Department provides a comprehensive flood information program to the public. Residents may access flood risk information and other flood information by calling the City Stormwater Department at 972-237-8321, meeting with a department representative in person, or by accessing the City's website at http://www.gptx.org/city-government/city-departments/planning-development/floodplain.

Do you want to know the flood zone of your property to determine your flood risk? The City provides a map information service enabling all residents to determine the flood zone of a specific property. The Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) Flood Insurance Rate Maps (FIRMs) are available for viewing at City Hall East, 300 W. Main St. Current FlRMs can be found at the following link on the City's Website: http://www.gptx.org/city-government/city-departments/planning-development/floodplain/flood-insurance-rate-maps and at the FEMA Flood Map Store at https://msc.fema.gov/portal.
