


STEVE DYE NAMED CITY MANAGER

Customer **SELF-SERVICE PORTAL**



The City of Grand Prairie is excited to announce improvements to the permitting and plan review process by introducing the Customer Self-Service (CSS) Portal.

Permit or plan applicants can now access the CSS portal from a computer, tablet or smart phone to create a new account, apply for permits, make payments online, request inspections, create new development cases, and view real-time data.

How do I use the (CSS) Permit Portal?

- An account will have to be created with your email address before you can apply for a permit.
- Any plans submitted for plan review will need to be in a PDF format. Invoices will be sent through the CSS portal for all plan review and permit fees.
- Inspections will be requested through the CSS portal.

September is National Preparedness Month! Are you prepared for the next disaster or emergency that could happen at any time? Here are some ways you, your family, and your community can "prepare to protect":

- Make a Plan: Talk to your family and friends about how you will communicate before, during, and after a disaster.
- Build a Kit: Gather supplies that will last for several days after a disaster for everyone living in your home. Don't forget to consider the unique needs each person or pet may have in case you have to evacuate quickly.
- **Prepare for Disasters:** Subscribe to Grand Prairie's free emergency notification system, Alert GP, to be alerted about severe weather and other emergencies in your area at www.gptx.org/disaster.
- Teach Youth About Preparedness: Talk to your kids about how to pre pare for and what to do in case you are separated in an emergency. Kids can visit ready.gov for online resources and play fun games like Disaster Master and Build a Kit!

Public Information and Flood Information Assistance

The city's Stormwater Division provides a comprehensive flood information program that is available to the public. Residents may obtain flood risk information including: basic map information, copies of Elevation Certificates, floodway information, depth of flooding information, lowest floor elevations, historical flood data, information on areas that flood outside of the designated Special Flood Hazard Area, erosion set-back areas, the natural functions of the Special Flood Hazard Areas, and other flood related information by visiting the City of Grand Prairie Stormwater Department and meeting with a department representative in person, by phone, or by visiting gptx.org/floodplain.
