COVID Update - Steve Dye, Deputy City Manager/Chief Operating Officer

Steve Dye, Deputy City Manager, Chief Operating Officer, stated that COVID positive cases were increasing. Most of the new reported cases were people 30 and under. There was also a record number of corona virus patients in Texas hospitals. Positive rates for testing in Grand Prairie was at 8% last week. Testing contracts changed to decrease home testing from three days to one day; drive-through testing was increased by one day. Mr. Dye went over small business assistance programs from both Dallas and Tarrant Counties. Mr. Dye said that in addition to small business assistance, Grand Prairie United Charities will be administering an assistance program for rent, mortgage and utilities for Grand Prairie citizens.

He said Council has the option to approve over 3.5%, possibly to 5% or 5.5%. He said sales tax would eventually come back but it could not be determined how much. He added that Municipal Court revenues are down and they may stay down from now on because of a downward trend in enforcement. Another issue is the Comptroller's change in situs of sales tax. He said in future years, staff would present a 3.5% budget and would try to further increase the homestead exemption.

On December 12, 2019, we discovered a water leak on the 12"water line located on the east side of Lakeridge Parkway at High Hawk Blvd/S. Great Southwest Parkway. Once the contractor identified the failed section of 12" water main it was determined, several issues led to the precipitous deterioration of the pressure reinforced concrete cylinder pipe (RCCP). The repair included removing and installing a new 12" water main line from the east side of Lakeridge Parkway to the west side by the contractor. We do not have the in-house capability to perform such a reparation.

The leak affected water service to such a large area an immediate response was critical, and therefore essential to restore the connection as soon as possible.

Local government code 252 allows for an exemption from the bid process for procurement necessary because

Competitive sealed proposals for the referenced project were received and opened publicly on Tuesday, June 6, 2017 at the City of Grand Prairie. A total of four (4) proposals were received. Below is a summary of qualified proposals and their respective proposed contract amounts:

SYB Construction Co., Inc.	\$ 576,470.00
Reytech Services LLC	\$ 697,125.50

Excel 4 Construction LLC was the low of the four proposers with a total bid of \$375,319.00 and 180 calendar days to complete the project. We checked the proposals for errors and omissions and found one on Reytech Services LLC's proposal, but it did not affect the overall price results.

An evaluation committee representing City Engineering and Public Works staff convened, reviewed, and evaluated the submitted proposals based on the evaluation criteria set forth by the competitive sealed proposal method of procurement. Evaluation criteria included proposed contract price, experience of the proposer with similar projects, experience and qualifications of key personnel, project methodology and schedule, past experience with the owner, proposed subcontractors, and financial stability. Based on the attached committee rankings of the aforementioned criteria, Excel 4 Construction LLC was the selected proposer with the highest total average ranking score of 87.20 points as compared to 78.20 points for SYB Construction Co., Inc.

We contacted the following references for Excel 4 Construction LLC and received favorable reviews for the work they performed and/or are currently performing for these entities on similar type projects. Most responded that Excel 4 Construction LLC's quality of work is very good and satisfactory and they had enough crews on the job and stayed on schedule. Most responses also noted their staff is responsive and easy to work with throughout the duration of projects.

The EpicCentral project will require a significant network infrastructure consisting of low voltage fiber optic cabling for voice, data and security provisions throughout the project. The proposal received from GTI includes providing installation labor and equipment, owner training, testing and commissioning of all systems to ensure proper operation. This vendor has worked with the City of Grand Prairie previously on numerous city projects and city staff has been pleased with their work and partnership throughout projects.

Gardner Telecommunications, Inc. (GTI) through their price agreement # 18040, approved by City Council on April 3, 2018, is able to provide the labor of this project.

Dynamic Vision through their price agreement # 20038, approved by City Council on January 7, 2020, offers the ground boxes for this project.

Graybar Electric Company, Inc. through their Omnia Partners contract # EV2370 offers the conduit for this project.

Chapter 271.102 of the Local Government Code authorizes local governments to participate in a cooperative purchasing program with another local government or local cooperative organization. Analysis

The State of Texas received a Presidential Disaster Declaration, DR-4272, following severe storms and flooding in May-June 2016. The Presidential Disaster Declaration allocated federal funding through the Hazard Mitigation Grant Program (HMGP) managed by the Federal Emergency Management Agency (FEMA) to communities in Texas impacted by the disaster. Although not directly impacted by these flooding events, the City is an eligible applicant for this grant opportunity.

The HMGP grant includes an allocation of funding for initiative projects, including generators. The City of Grand Prairie previously pursued two HMGP grants for a generator at the Dorchester Levee. The HMGP program received more funding requests than available funding and the project was not funded. The Stormwater Department, Streets Department and the Office of Emergency Management resubmitted the project to DR-4272 this year and was approved for partial funding.

As a stipulation of the DR-4272, the City is responsible for the engineering design of upgrades funding to the Dorchester Levee Pump Station. The firm of Freese & Nichols, Inc. was selected for their expertise in this field

and previous work on the project.

The scope of engineering design work for the Dorchester Levee Pump Emergency Generator Addition design will include the addition of a new diesel-fired emergency generator, with sound attenuated enclosure, a fuel tank on site at the existing pump station, SCADA upgrades to incorporate the emergency generator into the system, and the associated connections between the new emergency generator and existing pump station. Specific Scope of Work for the Dorchester Levee Pump Emergency Generator Addition

General – This scope of work is based upon the design of upgrades to the Dorchester Levee Pump Station. Upgrades will include the addition of a new diesel-fired emergency generator, with sound attenuated enclosure, a fuel tank on site at the existing pump station (PS), SCADA upgrades to incorporate the emergency generator into the system, and the associated connections between the new emergency generator and existing pump station (PS). Land acquisition is not included in this scope.

The new emergency generator will be sized to operate the full load of the pump station, including one 75 horsepower (hp) pump, two 150 hp pumps, and the PS ancillary loads. The new emergency generator will provide 480V power to the PS though the existing automatic transfer switch in the case of an electrical utility power failure. SCADA system upgrades will be coordinated with the existing Grand Prairie SCADA System.

The OWNER shall provide the following items for the development of the Project:

- Pay for all fees, permits, mitigation cost, utilities, and electric power service costs
- Project inspection

- Pre-qualification of all prospective bidders and issuing a list of eligible bidders prior to the bid opening is an additional service. Assist in a similar manner if Competitive Sealed Proposals are used as the procurement method.
- d. Assist the Owner in conducting a pre-bid conference for the construction projects and coordinate responses with Owner. Response to the pre-bid conference will be in the form of addenda issued after the conference. Attend the tour of the project site after the prebid conference.
- e. Assist Owner in the preparation of Construction Contract Documents for construction contracts. Provide ten (10) sets of Construction Contract Documents which include information from the apparent low bidders bid documents, legal documents, and addenda bound in the documents for execution by the Owner and construction contractor. FNI will endeavor to protect Owner in providing these services however, it is understood that FNI does not guarantee the Contractor's performance, nor is FNI responsible for supervision of the Contractor's operation and employees. FNI shall not be responsible for the means, methods, techniques, sequences or procedures of construction selected by the Contractor, or any safety precautions and programs relating in any way to the condition of the premises, the work of the Contractor or any Subcontractor. Prepare change order documentation for approved changes for execution by the Owner. Documentation of field orders, where cost to Owner is not impacted, will also be prepared. Investigations, analyses, studies or design for substitutions of equipment or materials, corrections of defective or deficient work of the contractor or other deviations from the construction contract documents requested by the contractor and approved by the Owner are an additional service. Substitutions of materials or equipment or design modifications requested by the Owner are an additional service.
- i. Prepare documentation for contract modifications required to implement modifications in the design of the project. Receive and evaluate notices of contractor claims and make recommendations to the Owner on the merit and value of the claim based on information submitted by the contractor or available in project documentation. Endeavor to negotiate a settlement value with the Contractor on behalf of the Owner if appropriate. Providing these services to review or evaluate construction contractor(s) claim(s), supported by causes not within the control of FNI are an additional service.
- j. Assist in the transfer of and acceptance by the construction contractor of any Owner furnished equipment or materials.

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- k. Conduct, in company with Owner's representative, a final review of the Project for conformance with the design concept of the Project and general compliance with the Construction Contract Documents. Prepare a list of deficiencies to be corrected by the contractor before recommendation of final payment. Assist the Owner in obtaining legal releases, permits, warranties, spare parts, and keys from the contractor. Review and comment on the certificate of completion and the recommendation for final payment to the Contractor(s). Visiting the site to review completed work more than two trips are an additional service.
- I. Revise the construction drawings in accordance with the information furnished by construction Contractor(s) reflecting changes in the Project made during construction. Two (2) sets of prints of "Record Drawings" shall be provided by FNI to Owner.

TERMS AND CONDITIONS OF AGREEMENT

- 1. **DEFINITIONS:** The term Client as used herein refers to the City of Grand Prairie, TX _. The term FNI as used herein refers to Freese and Nichols, Inc., its employees and agents; also its subcontractors and their employees and agents. As used herein, Services refers to the professional services performed by Freese and Nichols pursuant to the Agreement.
- 2. CHANGES: Client, without invalidating the Agreement, may order changes within the general scope of the work required by the Agreement by altering, adding to and/or deducting from the work to be performed. If any change under this clause causes an increase or decrease in FNI's cost of, or the time required for, the performance of any part of the Services under the Agreement, an equitable adjustment will be made by mutual agreement and the Agreement modified in writing accordingly.
- 3. **TERMINATION:** The obligation to provide services under this Agreement may be terminated by either party upon ten days' written notice. In the event of termination, FNI will be paid for all services rendered and reimbursable expenses incurred to the date of termination and, in addition, all reimbursable expenses directly attributable to termination.
- 4. CONSEQUENTIAL DAMAGES: In no event shall FNI or its subcontractors be liable in contract, tort, strict liability, warranty, or otherwise for any special, indirect, incidental or consequential damages, such as loss of product, loss of use of the equipment or system, loss of anticipated profits or revenue, non-operation or increased expense of operation or other equipment or systems.
- 5. INFORMATION FURNISHED BY CLIENT: Client will assist FNI by placing at FNI's disposal all available information pertinent to the Project including previous reports and any other data relative to design or construction of the Project. FNI shall have no liability for defects or negligence in the Services attributable to FNI's reliance upon or use of data, design criteria, drawings, specifications or other information furnished by Client and Client agrees to indemnify and hold FNI harmless from any and all claims and judgments, and all losses, costs and expenses arising therefrom. FNI shall disclose to Client, prior to use thereof, defects or omissions in the data, design criteria, drawings, specifications or other information furnished by Client to FNI that FNI may reasonably discover in its review and inspection thereof.
- 6. **INSURANCE:** FNI shall provide to Client certificates of insurance which shall contain the following minimum coverage:

Automobile Liability (Any Auto) **Professional Liability**

- 7. SUBCONTRACTS: If, for any reason, at any time during the progress of providing Services, Client determines that any subcontractor for FNI is incompetent or undesirable, Client will notify FNI accordingly and FNI shall take immediate steps for cancellation of such subcontract. Subletting by subcontractors shall be subject to the same regulations. Nothing contained in the Agreement shall create any contractual relation between any subcontractor and Client.
- 8. OWNERSHIP OF DOCUMENTS: All drawings, reports data and other project information developed in the execution of the Services provided under this Agreement shall be the property of the Client upon payment of FNI's fees for services. FNI may retain copies for record purposes. Client agrees such documents are not intended or represented to be suitable for reuse by Client or others. Any reuse by Client or by those who obtained said documents from Client without written verification or adaptation by FNI will be at Client's sole risk and without liability or legal exposure to FNI, or to FNI's independent associates or consultants, and Client shall indemnify and hold harmless FNI and FNI's independent associates and consultants from all claims, damages, losses and expenses including attorneys' fees arising out of or resulting therefrom. Any such verification or adaptation will entitle FNI to further reasonable compensation. FNI may reuse all drawings, report data and other project information in the execution of the Services provided under this Agreement in FNI's other activities. Any reuse by FNI will be at FNI's sole risk and without liability or legal exposure to Client, and FNI shall indemnify and hold harmless Client from all claims, damages, losses and expenses including attorneys' fees arising out of or resulting therefrom.

- 9. **POLLUTANTS AND HAZARDOUS WASTES:** It is understood and agreed that FNI has neither created nor contributed to the creation or existence of any hazardous, radioactive, toxic, irritant, pollutant, or otherwise dangerous substance or condition at the site, if any, and its compensation hereunder is in no way commensurate with the potential risk of injury or loss that may be caused by exposures to such substances or conditions. The parties agree that in performing the Services required by this Agreement, FNI does not take possession or control of the subject site, but acts as an invitee in performing the services, and is not therefore responsible for the existence of any pollutant present on or migrating from the site. Further, FNI shall have no responsibility for any pollutant during clean-up, transportation, storage or disposal activities.
- OPINION OF PROBABLE COSTS: FNI will furnish an opinion of probable project development cost based on present day cost, but does not guarantee the accuracy of such estimates. Opinions of probable cost, financial evaluations, feasibility studies, economic analyses of alternate solutions and utilitarian considerations of operations and maintenance costs prepared by FNI hereunder will be made on the basis of FNI's experience and qualifications and represent FNI's judgment as an experienced and qualified design professional. It is recognized, however, that FNI does not have control over the cost of labor, material, equipment or services furnished by others or over market conditions or contractors' methods of determining their prices.
- 11. **CONSTRUCTION REPRESENTATION:** If required by the Agreement, FNI will furnish Construction Representation according to the defined scope for these services. FNI will observe the progress and the quality of work to determine in general if the work is proceeding in accordance with the Contract Documents. In performing these services, FNI will endeavor to protect Client against defects and deficiencies in the work of Contractors; FNI will report any observed deficiencies to Client, however, it is understood that FNI does not guarantee the Contractor's performance, nor is FNI responsible for the supervision of the Contractor's operation and employees. FNI shall not be responsible for the means, methods, techniques, sequences or procedures of construction selected by the Contractor, or the safety precautions and programs incident to the work of the Contractor. FNI shall not be responsible for the acts or omissions of any person (except his own employees or agent) at the Project site or otherwise performing any of the work of the Project. If Client designates a person to serve in the capacity of Resident Project Representative who is not a FNI's employee or FNI's agent, the duties, responsibilities and limitations of authority of such Resident Project Representative(s) will be set forth in writing and made a part of this Agreement before the Construction Phase of the Project begins.
- 12. **PAYMENT:** Progress payments may be requested by FNI based on the amount of services completed. Payment for the services of FNI shall be due and payable upon submission of a statement for services to CLIENT and in acceptance of the services as satisfactory by the CLIENT. Statements for services shall not be submitted more frequently than monthly. Any applicable new taxes imposed upon services, expenses, and charges by any governmental body after the execution of this Agreement will be added to FNI's compensation.

If CLIENT fails to make any payment due FNI for services and expenses within thirty (30) days after receipt of FNI's statement for services therefore, the amounts due FNI will be increased at the rate of one percent (1%) per month from said thirtieth (30th) day, and, in addition, FNI may, after giving seven (7) days' written notice to CLIENT, suspend services under this Agreement until FNI has been paid in full, all amounts due for services, expenses and charges.

- 13. **ARBITRATION:** No arbitration arising out of, or relating to, this Agreement involving one party to this Agreement may include the other party to this Agreement without their approval.
- 14. **SUCCESSORS AND ASSIGNMENTS:** CLIENT and FNI each are hereby bound and the partners, successors, executors, administrators and legal representatives of CLIENT and FNI are hereby bound to the other party to this Agreement and to the partners, successors, executors, administrators and legal representatives (and said assigns) of such other party, in respect of all covenants, agreements and obligations of this Agreement.

Neither CLIENT nor FNI shall assign, sublet or transfer any rights under or interest in (including, but without limitation, moneys that may become due or moneys that are due) this Agreement without the written consent of the other, except to the extent that any assignment, subletting or transfer is mandated by law or the effect of this limitation may be restricted by law. Unless specifically stated to the contrary in any written consent to an assignment, no assignment will release or discharge the assignor from any duty or responsibility under this Agreement. Nothing contained in this paragraph shall prevent FNI from employing such independent associates and consultants as FNI may deem appropriate to assist in the performance of services hereunder.

15. **PURCHASE ORDERS:** If a Purchase Order is used to authorize FNI's Services, only the terms, conditions/instructions typed on the face of the Purchase Order shall apply to this Agreement. Should there be any conflict between the Purchase Order and the terms of this Agreement, then this Agreement shall prevail and shall be determinative of the conflict.

This project provides for the construction of approximately 4,900 L.F of 6 concrete lanes divided roadway (89-foot wide) with utilities from IH 20 to Mayfield Road.

This will provide required parking space of 2,112 square feet to allow for conversion of an existing machine shop to tire store. The requested parking space is between the east curb line of Northeast 31st Street and the converted tire shop. Construction of the new concrete parking will be according to City standards. Drainage will be maintained with drainage to the existing inlet on the west side of the Northeast 31st Street and Main Street.



On September 14, 2018 the City approved an initial architectural design contract with Merriman Anderson Architects (PO #338360) in the amount of \$45,975 for conceptual design services.

On December 11, 2018 the City Council approved an additional architectural design contract with Merriman Anderson Architects (18-8498) for schematic design services for EpicCentral in the amount of \$650,000.

The City Council then approved an additional architectural design contract with Merriman Anderson Architects (19-9413) in the amount of \$2,538,650 for the balance of professional services including design development, construction document production, bidding/negotiation consultation and construction administration for the EpicCentral (City Phase) project. In addition to the fee proposal balance for Merriman Anderson Architects, staff recommended a 5% design contingency in the amount of \$126,933 along with a reimbursable expenses allowance of \$80,525 resulting in a total request of \$2,746,108 at the October 15, 2019 City Council meeting.

On September 3, 2019 the City Council approved an initial contract with Hill & Wilkinson General Contractors (19-9280) for pre-construction services in the amount of \$30,000. The City then approved an amendment to the H&W pre-construction services contract on May 26, 2020 in the amount of \$45,000.

The current Construction Manager at Risk (CMAR) Construction Contract in the amount of \$6,878,130 represents the following scope of work associated with the initial construction scope of work for the EpicCentral (City Phase) project:

- Demolition of Esplanade Drive (within the site boundary of EpicCentral only)
- Removal and/or abandonment of existing utilities associated with Esplanade Drive
- New site utilities and reconnection of previously existing utilities via new pathways
- Park Central Drive relocation and extension
- Highway 161 deceleration lane for relocated Park Central Drive
- Creation of construction-ready pad site
- Construction of 260 parking spaces

Costs above and beyond the Hill & Wilkinson scope of services are as follows:

- 5% owner-controlled contingency (\$343,907);
- Allowance for Oncor infrastructure and equipment (\$500,000)
- Allowance for owner construction testing (\$250,000)
- Allowance for Atmos infrastructure and equipment requirements (\$225,000)
- Allowance for signage and site furnishings (\$100,000)
- Allowance for security provisions (\$75,000)
- Allowance for IT/data installation (\$50,000)

The items above that are applicable to the performance of the Construction Manager at Risk (CMAR) will be incorporated with the previous Hill & Wilkinson pre-construction contract values for a revised total contract in the amount of \$6,953,130.

Due to the scope and complexity of the Project it is important to proceed with this phase of the Project before the Drawings and Specifications and Guaranteed Maximum Price for the other phases of the Project have been prepared. As the Drawings and Specifications for each of the other phases of the Project are completed, the Guaranteed Maximum Price will be modified to include those elements and will be brought before City Council for consideration. These modifications to the Guaranteed Maximum Price will be amendments to the Contract and do not constitute change orders under Section 252.048(d) of the Texas Local Government Code.

The Public Safety Building (PSB) was constructed and occupied in 2010 but over the years the PSB has experienced issues with foundation shifting and settling. This has caused under-slab drain lines in the outbuildings to become damaged and crushed. A short-term solution has been implemented, but Facility Services and Police Department staff have sought a permanent repair solution.

The Home Depot is recommending cutting and excavating the concrete slab in ten locations within the outbuildings to repair the broken drain lines. Proper backfill will be utilized to help prevent future damage. This project includes an amount not to exceed \$33,500 for unforeseen issues during the repair process. Any unused portions of this amount will be retained in the City's budgets.

Chapter 271.102 of the Local Government Code authorizes local governments to participate in a cooperative purchasing program with another local government or local cooperative organization. In lieu of competitive bidding, items and services may be purchased through such agreements as the agreements have already been bid by the sponsoring entity or agency. The City of Grand Prairie has master Interlocal cooperative agreements

with various entities including U.S. Communities.

U.S. Communities is the leading national government purchasing cooperative, providing world class government procurement resources and solutions to local and state government agencies, school districts (K-12), higher education institutes, and nonprofits looking for the best overall supplier government pricing. The State and Local Government shall be collectively referred to as "the parties" hereinafter.

WITNESSETH

WHEREAS, federal law establishes federally funded programs for transportation improvements to implement its public purposes, and

WHEREAS, the Texas Transportation Code, Section 201.103 establishes that the State shall design, construct and operate a system of highways in cooperation with local governments, and Section 222.052 authorizes the Texas Transportation Commission to accept contributions from political subdivisions for development and construction of public roads and the state highway system within the political subdivision, and

WHEREAS, federal and state laws require local governments to meet certain contract standards relating to the management and administration of State and federal funds, and

WHEREAS, the Texas Transportation Commission has codified 43 TAC, Rules 15.50-15.56 that describe federal, state, and local responsibilities for cost participation in highway improvement and other transportation projects, and

WHEREAS, the Texas Transportation Commission passed Minute Order Number 115550 authorizing the State to undertake and complete a highway improvement or other transportation project generally described as Bicycle and Pedestrian Improvements. The portion of the project work covered by this Agreement is identified in the Agreement, Article 3, Scope of Work (Project), and

1. Responsible Parties:

2. Period of the Agreement

This Agreement becomes effective when signed by the last party whose signing makes the Agreement fully executed. This Agreement shall remain in effect until the Project is completed or unless terminated as provided below.

3. Scope of Work

The scope of work for the Project consists of construction of a Regional Veloweb trail, 12 foot wide concrete hike and bike trail from the termination of Fort Worth Trail at Corporate to Mike Lewis Park near Roy Orr Boulevard. The trail will parallel Trinity Boulevard and turn south paralleling Roy Orr. The trail will continue south until it reaches Mike Lewis Park.

4. Project Sources and Uses of Funds

The total estimated cost of the Project is shown in Attachment C, Project Budget (Attachment C) which is attached to and made a part of this Agreement.

A. If the Local Government will perform any work under this Agreement for which reimbursement will be provided by or through the State, the Local Government must complete training. If federal funds are being used, the training must be completed before federal spending authority is obligated. Training is complete when at least one individual who is working actively and directly on the Project successfully completes and receives a certificate for the course entitled "Local Government Project Procedures and Qualification for the Texas Department of Transportation" and retains qualification in accordance with applicable TxDOT procedures. Upon request, the Local Government shall provide the certificate of qualification to the State. The individual who receives the training certificate may be an employee of the Local Government or an employee of a firm that has been contracted by the Local Government to perform oversight of the Project. The State in its discretion may deny reimbursement if the

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Local Government has not continuously designated in writing a qualified individual to work actively on or to directly oversee the Project.

- B. The expected cash contributions from the federal government, the State, the Local Government, or other parties are shown in Attachment C. The State will pay for only those Project costs that have been approved by the Texas Transportation Commission. For projects with federal funds, the State and the federal government will not reimburse the Local Government for any work performed before the federal spending authority is formally obligated to the Project by the Federal Highway Administration (FHWA). After federal funds have been obligated, the State will send to the Local Government a copy of the formal documentation showing the obligation of funds including federal award information. The Local Government is responsible for 100% of the cost of any work performed under its direction or control before the federal spending authority is formally obligated.
- C. Attachment C shows, by major cost categories, the cost estimates and the party responsible for performing the work for each category. These categories may include but are not limited to: (1) costs of real property; (2) costs of utility work; (3) costs of environmental assessment and remediation; (4) cost of preliminary engineering and design; (5) cost of construction and construction management; and (6) any other local project costs.
- D. The State will be responsible for securing the federal and State share of the funding required for the development and construction of the local Project. If the Local Government is due funds for expenses incurred, these funds will be reimbursed to the Local Government on a cost basis.
- E. The Local Government will be responsible for all non-federal or non-State participation costs associated with the Project, unless otherwise provided for in this Agreement or approved otherwise in an amendment to this Agreement. For items of work subject to specified percentage funding, the Local Government shall only in those instances be responsible for all Project costs that are greater than the maximum State and federal participation specified in Attachment C and for overruns in excess of the amount specified in Attachment C to be paid by the Local Government.
- F. The budget in Attachment C will clearly state all items subject to fixed price funding, specified percentage funding, and the periodic payment schedule, when periodic payments have been approved by the State.
- G. When the Local Government bears the responsibility for paying cost overruns, the Local Government shall make payment to the State within thirty (30) days from the receipt of the State's written notification of additional funds being due.
- H. When fixed price funding is used, the Local Government is responsible for the fixed price amount specified in Attachment C. Fixed prices are not subject to adjustment unless (1) differing site conditions are encountered; (2) further definition of the Local Government's requested scope of work identifies greatly differing costs from those estimated; (3) work requested by the Local Government is determined to be ineligible for federal participation; or (4) the adjustment is mutually agreed to by the State and the Local Government.
- I. Prior to the performance of any engineering review work by the State, the Local Government will pay to the State the amount specified in Attachment C. At a minimum, this amount shall equal the Local Government's funding share for the estimated cost of

preliminary engineering performed or reviewed by the State for the Project. At least sixty (60) days prior to the date set for receipt of the construction bids, the Local Government shall remit its remaining financial share for the State's estimated construction oversight and construction cost.

- J. The State will not execute the contract for the construction of the Project until the required funding has been made available by the Local Government in accordance with this Agreement.
- K. Whenever funds are paid by the Local Government to the State under this Agreement, the Local Government shall remit a check or warrant made payable to the "Texas Department of Transportation" or may use the State's Automated Clearing House (ACH) system for electronic transfer of funds in accordance with instructions provided by TxDOT's Finance Division. The funds shall be deposited and managed by the State and may only be applied by the State to the Project.
- L. The State will not pay interest on any funds provided by the Local Government.
- M. If a waiver for the collection of indirect costs for a service project has been granted under 43 TAC §15.56, the State will not charge the Local Government for the indirect costs the State incurs on the Project, unless this Agreement is terminated at the request of the Local Government prior to completion of the Project.
- N. If the Local Government is an Economically Disadvantaged County (EDC) and if the State has approved adjustments to the standard financing arrangement, this Agreement reflects those adjustments.
- O. Where the Local Government is authorized to perform services under this Agreement and be reimbursed by the State, the Local Government is authorized to submit requests for reimbursement by submitting the original of an itemized invoice, in a form and containing all items required by the State, no more frequently than monthly and no later than ninety (90) days after costs are incurred. If the Local Government submits invoices more than ninety (90) days after the costs are incurred and if federal funding is reduced as a result, the State shall have no responsibility to reimburse the Local Government for those costs.
- P. Upon completion of the Project, the State will perform a final accounting of the Project costs for all items of work with specified percentage funding. Any funds due by the Local Government, the State, or the federal government for these work items will be promptly paid by the owing party.
- Q. The state auditor may conduct an audit or investigation of any entity receiving funds from the State directly under this Agreement or indirectly through a subcontract under this Agreement. Acceptance of funds directly under this Agreement or indirectly through a subcontract under this Agreement acts as acceptance of the authority of the state auditor, under the direction of the legislative audit committee, to conduct an audit or investigation in connection with those funds. An entity that is the subject of an audit or investigation must provide the state auditor with access to any information the state auditor considers relevant to the investigation or audit.
- R. Payment under this Agreement beyond the end of the current fiscal biennium is subject to availability of appropriated funds. If funds are not appropriated, this Agreement shall be terminated immediately with no liability to either party.

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5. Termination of This Agreement

This Agreement shall remain in effect until the Project is completed and accepted by all parties, unless:

- A. The Agreement is terminated in writing with the mutual consent of the parties;
- B. The Agreement is terminated by one party because of a breach, in which case any costs incurred because of the breach shall be paid by the breaching party:
- C. The Local Government elects not to provide funding after the completion of preliminary engineering, specifications, and estimates (PS&E) and the Project does not proceed because of insufficient funds, in which case the Local Government agrees to reimburse the State for its reasonable actual costs incurred during the Project; or
- D. The Agreement is terminated by the State because the parties are not able to execute a mutually agreeable amendment when the costs for Local Government requested items increase significantly due to differing site conditions, determination that Local government requested work is ineligible for federal or state cost participation, or a more thorough definition of the Local Government's proposed work scope identifies greatly differing costs from those estimated. The State will reimburse Local Government remaining funds to the Local Government within ninety (90) days of termination; or
- E. The Project is inactive for thirty-six (36) consecutive months or longer and no expenditures have been charged against federal funds, in which case the State may in its discretion terminate this Agreement.

6. Amendments

Amendments to this Agreement due to changes in the character of the work, terms of the Agreement, or responsibilities of the parties relating to the Project may be enacted through a mutually agreed upon, written amendment.

7. Remedies

This Agreement shall not be considered as specifying the exclusive remedy for any agreement default, but all remedies existing at law and in equity may be availed of by either party to this Agreement and shall be cumulative.

8. Utilities

The party named in Article 1, Responsible Parties, under AGREEMENT shall be responsible for the adjustment, removal, or relocation of utility facilities in accordance with applicable state laws, regulations, rules, policies, and procedures, including any cost to the State of a delay resulting from the Local Government's failure to ensure that utility facilities are adjusted, removed, or relocated before the scheduled beginning of construction. The Local Government will not be reimbursed with federal or State funds for the cost of required utility work. The Local Government must obtain advance approval for any variance from established procedures. Before a construction contract is let, the Local Government shall provide, at the State's request, a certification stating that the Local Government has completed the adjustment of all utilities that must be adjusted before construction is commenced.

9. Environmental Assessment and Mitigation

Development of a transportation project must comply with the National Environmental Policy Act and the National Historic Preservation Act of 1966, which require environmental clearance

of federal-aid projects. The party named in Article 1, Responsible Parties, under AGREEMENT is responsible for the following:

- A. The identification and assessment of any environmental problems associated with the development of a local project governed by this Agreement.
- B. The cost of any environmental problem's mitigation and remediation.
- C. Providing any public meetings or public hearings required for the environmental assessment process. Public hearings will not be held prior to the approval of the Project schematic.
- D. The preparation of the NEPA documents required for the environmental clearance of this Project.

If the Local Government is responsible for the environmental assessment and mitigation, before the advertisement for bids, the Local Government shall provide to the State written documentation from the appropriate regulatory agency or agencies that all environmental clearances have been obtained.

10. Compliance with Accessibility Standards

All parties to this Agreement shall ensure that the plans for and the construction of all projects subject to this Agreement are in compliance with standards issued or approved by the Texas Department of Licensing and Regulation (TDLR) as meeting or consistent with minimum accessibility requirements of the Americans with Disabilities Act (P.L. 101-336) (ADA).

11. Architectural and Engineering Services

The party named in Article 1, Responsible Parties, under AGREEMENT has responsibility for the performance of architectural and engineering services. The engineering plans shall be developed in accordance with the applicable State's *Standard Specifications for Construction and Maintenance of Highways, Streets and Bridges* and the special specifications and special provisions related to it. For projects on the State highway system, the design shall, at a minimum conform to applicable State manuals. For projects not on the State highway system, the design shall, at a minimum, conform to applicable American Association of State Highway and Transportation Officials (AASHTO) design standards.

In procuring professional services, the parties to this Agreement must comply with federal requirements cited in 23 CFR Part 172 if the Project is federally funded and with Texas Government Code 2254, Subchapter A, in all cases. Professional contracts for federally funded projects must conform to federal requirements, specifically including the provision for participation by Disadvantaged Business Enterprises (DBEs), ADA, and environmental matters. If the Local Government is the responsible party, the Local Government shall submit its procurement selection process for prior approval by the State. All professional services contracts must be reviewed and approved by the State prior to execution by the Local Government.

12. Construction Responsibilities

The party named in Article 1, Responsible Parties, under AGREEMENT is responsible for the following:

- A. Advertise for construction bids, issue bid proposals, receive and tabulate the bids, and award and administer the contract for construction of the Project. Administration of the contract includes the responsibility for construction engineering and for issuance of any change orders, supplemental agreements, amendments, or additional work orders that may become necessary subsequent to the award of the construction contract. In order to ensure federal funding eligibility, projects must be authorized by the State prior to advertising for construction.
- B. If the State is the responsible party, the State will use its approved contract letting and award procedures to let and award the construction contract.
- C. If the Local Government is the responsible party, the Local Government shall submit its contract letting and award procedures to the State for review and approval prior to letting.
- D. If the Local Government is the responsible party, the State must concur with the low bidder selection before the Local Government can enter into a contract with the vendor.
- E. If the Local Government is the responsible party, the State must review and approve change orders.
- F. Upon completion of the Project, the party responsible for constructing the Project will issue and sign a "Notification of Completion" acknowledging the Project's construction completion and submit certification(s) sealed by a professional engineer(s) licensed in the State of Texas.
- G. For federally funded contracts, the parties to this Agreement will comply with federal construction requirements cited in 23 CFR Part 635 and with requirements cited in 23 CFR Part 633, and shall include the latest version of Form "FHWA-1273" in the contract bidding documents. If force account work will be performed, a finding of cost effectiveness shall be made in compliance with 23 CFR 635, Subpart B.

13. Project Maintenance

The Local Government shall be responsible for maintenance of locally owned roads and locally owned facilities after completion of the work. The State shall be responsible for maintenance of the State highway system after completion of the work if the work was on the State highway system, unless otherwise provided for in existing maintenance agreements with the Local Government.

14. Right of Way and Real Property

The party named in Article 1, Responsible Parties, under AGREEMENT is responsible for the provision and acquisition of any needed right of way or real property.

The Local Government shall be responsible for the following:

- A. Right of way and real property acquisition shall be the responsibility of the Local Government. Title to right of way and other related real property must be acceptable to the State before funds may be expended for the improvement of the right of way or real property.
- B. If the Local Government is the owner of any part of the Project site under this Agreement, the Local Government shall permit the State or its authorized representative access to occupy the site to perform all activities required to execute the work.

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- C. All parties to this Agreement will comply with and assume the costs for compliance with all the requirements of Title II and Title III of the Uniform Relocation Assistance and Real Property Acquisition Policies Act of 1970, Title 42 U.S.C.A. Section 4601 et seq., including those provisions relating to incidental expenses incurred by the property owners in conveying the real property to the Local Government and benefits applicable to the relocation of any displaced person as defined in 49 CFR Section 24.2(g). Documentation to support such compliance must be maintained and made available to the State and its representatives for review and inspection.
- D. The Local Government shall assume all costs and perform necessary requirements to provide any necessary evidence of title or right of use in the name of the Local Government to the real property required for development of the Project. The evidence of title or rights shall be acceptable to the State, and be free and clear of all encroachments. The Local Government shall secure and provide easements and any needed rights of entry over any other land needed to develop the Project according to the approved Project plans. The Local Government shall be responsible for securing any additional real property required for completion of the Project.
- E. In the event real property is donated to the Local Government after the date of the State's authorization, the Local Government will provide all documentation to the State regarding fair market value of the acquired property. The State will review the Local Government's appraisal, determine the fair market value and credit that amount towards the Local Government's financial share. If donated property is to be used as a funding match, it may not be provided by the Local Government. The State will not reimburse the Local Government for any real property acquired before execution of this Agreement and the obligation of federal spending authority.
- F. The Local Government shall prepare real property maps, property descriptions, and other data as needed to properly describe the real property and submit them to the State for approval prior to the Local Government acquiring the real property. Tracings of the maps shall be retained by the Local Government for a permanent record.
- G. The Local Government agrees to make a determination of property values for each real property parcel by methods acceptable to the State and to submit to the State a tabulation of the values so determined, signed by the appropriate Local Government representative. The tabulations shall list the parcel numbers, ownership, acreage and recommended compensation. Compensation shall be shown in the component parts of land acquired, itemization of improvements acquired, damages (if any) and the amounts by which the total compensation will be reduced if the owner retains improvements. This tabulation shall be accompanied by an explanation to support the determined values, together with a copy of information or reports used in calculating all determined values. Expenses incurred by the Local Government in performing this work may be eligible for reimbursement after the Local Government has received written authorization by the State to proceed with determination of real property values. The State will review the data submitted and may base its reimbursement for parcel acquisitions on these values.
- H. Reimbursement for real property costs will be made to the Local Government for real property purchased in an amount not to exceed eighty percent (80%) of the cost of the real property purchased in accordance with the terms and provisions of this Agreement. Reimbursement will be in an amount not to exceed eighty percent (80%)

of the State's predetermined value of each parcel, or the net cost of the parcel, whichever is less. In addition, reimbursement will be made to the Local Government for necessary payments to appraisers, expenses incurred in order to assure good title, and costs associated with the relocation of displaced persons and personal property as well as incidental expenses.

If the Project requires the use of real property to which the Local Government will not hold title, a separate agreement between the owners of the real property and the Local Government must be executed prior to execution of this Agreement. The separate agreement must establish that the Project will be dedicated for public use for a period of not less than 10 (ten) years after completion. The separate agreement must define the responsibilities of the parties as to the use of the real property and operation and maintenance of the Project after completion. The separate agreement must be approved by the State prior to its execution. A copy of the executed agreement shall be provided to the State.

15. Insurance

If this Agreement authorizes the Local Government or its contractor to perform any work on State right of way, before beginning work, the entity performing the work shall provide the State with a fully executed copy of the State's Form 1560 Certificate of Insurance verifying the existence of coverage in the amounts and types specified on the Certificate of Insurance for all persons and entities working on State right of way. This coverage shall be maintained until all work on the State right of way is complete. If coverage is not maintained, all work on State right of way shall cease immediately, and the State may recover damages and all costs of completing the work.

16. Notices

All notices to either party shall be delivered personally or sent by certified or U.S. mail, postage prepaid, addressed to that party at the following address:

All notices shall be deemed given on the date delivered in person or deposited in the mail, unless otherwise provided by this Agreement. Either party may change the above address by sending written notice of the change to the other party. Either party may request in writing that notices shall be delivered personally or by certified U.S. mail, and that request shall be carried out by the other party.

17. Legal Construction

If one or more of the provisions contained in this Agreement shall for any reason be held invalid, illegal, or unenforceable in any respect, such invalidity, illegality, or unenforceability

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shall not affect any other provisions and this Agreement shall be construed as if it did not contain the invalid, illegal, or unenforceable provision.

18. Responsibilities of the Parties

The State and the Local Government agree that neither party is an agent, servant, or employee of the other party, and each party agrees it is responsible for its individual acts and deeds as well as the acts and deeds of its contractors, employees, representatives, and agents.

19. Ownership of Documents

Upon completion or termination of this Agreement, all documents prepared by the State shall remain the property of the State. All data and information prepared under this Agreement shall be made available to the State without restriction or limitation on their further use. All documents produced or approved or otherwise created by the Local Government shall be transmitted to the State, in the format directed by the State, on a monthly basis or as required by the State. The originals shall remain the property of the Local Government.

20. Compliance with Laws

The parties to this Agreement shall comply with all federal, state, and local laws, statutes, ordinances, rules and regulations, and the orders and decrees of any courts or administrative bodies or tribunals in any manner affecting the performance of this Agreement. When required, the Local Government shall furnish the State with satisfactory proof of this compliance.

21. Sole Agreement

This Agreement constitutes the sole and only agreement between the parties and supersedes any prior understandings or written or oral agreements respecting the Agreement's subject matter.

22. Cost Principles

In order to be reimbursed with federal funds, the parties shall comply with the cost principles established in 2 CFR 200 that specify that all reimbursed costs are allowable, reasonable, and allocable to the Project.

23. Procurement and Property Management Standards

The parties to this Agreement shall adhere to the procurement and property management standards established in 2 CFR 200, Uniform Administrative Requirements, Cost Principles, and Audit Requirements for Federal Awards, and to the Texas Uniform Grant Management Standards. The State must pre-approve the Local Government's procurement procedures for purchases to be eligible for state or federal funds.

24. Inspection of Books and Records

The parties to this Agreement shall maintain all books, documents, papers, accounting records, and other documentation relating to costs incurred under this Agreement and shall make such materials available to the State, the Local Government, and, if federally funded, the FHWA and the U.S. Office of the Inspector General or their duly authorized representatives for

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review and inspection at its office during the Agreement period and for seven (7) years from the date of final reimbursement by FHWA under this Agreement or until any impending litigation or claims are resolved. Additionally, the State, the Local Government, and the FHWA and their duly authorized representatives shall have access to all the governmental records that are directly applicable to this Agreement for the purpose of making audits, examinations, excerpts, and transcriptions.

25. Civil Rights Compliance

The parties to this Agreement are responsible for the following:

- A. <u>Compliance with Regulations:</u> Both parties will comply with the Acts and the Regulations relative to Nondiscrimination in Federally-assisted programs of the U.S. Department of Transportation (USDOT), the Federal Highway Administration (FHWA), as they may be amended from time to time, which are herein incorporated by reference and made part of this Agreement.
- B. <u>Nondiscrimination:</u> The Local Government, with regard to the work performed by it during the Agreement, will not discriminate on the grounds of race, color, or national origin in the selection and retention of subcontractors, including procurement of materials and leases of equipment. The Local Government will not participate directly or indirectly in the discrimination prohibited by the Acts and the Regulations, including employment practices when the Agreement covers any activity, project, or program set forth in Appendix B of 49 CFR Part 21.
- C. <u>Solicitations for Subcontracts, Including Procurement of Materials and Equipment:</u> In all solicitations either by competitive bidding or negotiation made by the Local Government for work to be performed under a subcontract, including procurement of materials or leases of equipment, each potential subcontractor or supplier will be notified by the Local Government of the Local Government's obligations under this Agreement and the Acts and Regulations relative to Nondiscrimination on the grounds of race, color, or national origin.
- D. Information and Reports: The Local Government will provide all information and reports required by the Acts, the Regulations, and directives issued pursuant thereto, and will permit access to its books, records, accounts, other sources of information, and facilities as may be determined by the State or the FHWA to be pertinent to ascertain compliance with such Acts, Regulations or directives. Where any information required of the Local Government is in the exclusive possession of another who fails or refuses to furnish this information, the Local Government will so certify to the State or the FHWA, as appropriate, and will set forth what efforts it has made to obtain the information.
- E. <u>Sanctions for Noncompliance</u>: In the event of the Local Government's noncompliance with the Nondiscrimination provisions of this Agreement, the State will impose such contract sanctions as it or the FHWA may determine to be appropriate, including, but not limited to:
 - 1. withholding of payments to the Local Government under the Agreement until the Local Government complies and/or
- 2. cancelling, terminating, or suspending of the Agreement, in whole or in part.
 F. <u>Incorporation of Provisions:</u> The Local Government will include the provisions of paragraphs (A) through (F) in every subcontract, including procurement of materials

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and leases of equipment, unless exempt by the Acts, the Regulations and directives issued pursuant thereto. The Local Government will take such action with respect to any subcontract or procurement as the State or the FHWA may direct as a means of enforcing such provisions including sanctions for noncompliance. Provided, that if the Local Government becomes involved in, or is threatened with, litigation with a subcontractor or supplier because of such direction, the Local Government may request the State to enter into such litigation to protect the interests of the State. In addition, the Local Government may request the United States to enter into such litigation to protect the interests of the United States.

26. Pertinent Non-Discrimination Authorities

During the performance of this Agreement, each party, for itself, its assignees, and successors in interest agree to comply with the following nondiscrimination statutes and authorities; including but not limited to:

- A. Title VI of the Civil Rights Act of 1964 (42 U.S.C. § 2000d et seq., 78 stat. 252), (prohibits discrimination on the basis of race, color, national origin); and 49 CFR Part 21.
- B. The Uniform Relocation Assistance and Real Property Acquisition Policies Act of 1970, (42 U.S.C. § 4601), (prohibits unfair treatment of persons displaced or whose property has been acquired because of federal or federal-aid programs and projects).
- C. Federal-Aid Highway Act of 1973, (23 U.S.C. § 324 et seq.), as amended, (prohibits discrimination on the basis of sex).
- D. Section 504 of the Rehabilitation Act of 1973, (29 U.S.C. § 794 et seq.) as amended, (prohibits discrimination on the basis of disability); and 49 CFR Part 27.
- E. The Age Discrimination Act of 1975, as amended, (42 U.S.C. § 6101 et seq.), (prohibits discrimination on the basis of age).
- F. Airport and Airway Improvement Act of 1982, (49 U.S.C. Chapter 471, Section 47123), as amended, (prohibits discrimination based on race, creed, color, national origin, or sex).
- G. The Civil Rights Restoration Act of 1987, (PL 100-209), (Broadened the scope, coverage and applicability of Title VI of the Civil Rights Act of 1964, The Age Discrimination Act of 1975 and Section 504 of the Rehabilitation Act of 1973, by expanding the definition of the terms "programs or activities" to include all of the programs or activities of the federal-aid recipients, subrecipients and contractors, whether such programs or activities are federally funded or not).
- H. Titles II and III of the Americans with Disabilities Act, which prohibits discrimination on the basis of disability in the operation of public entities, public and private transportation systems, places of public accommodation, and certain testing entities (42 U.S.C. §§ 12131-12189) as implemented by Department of Transportation regulations at 49 C.F.R. parts 37 and 38.
- I. The Federal Aviation Administration's Nondiscrimination statute (49 U.S.C. § 47123) (prohibits discrimination on the basis of race, color, national origin, and sex).
- J. Executive Order 12898, Federal Actions to Address Environmental Justice in Minority Populations and Low-Income Populations, which ensures nondiscrimination against minority populations by discouraging programs, policies, and activities with disproportionately high and adverse human health or environmental effects on minority and low-income populations.

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- K. Executive Order 13166, Improving Access to Services for Persons with Limited English Proficiency, and resulting agency guidance, national origin discrimination includes discrimination because of limited English proficiency (LEP). To ensure compliance with Title VI, the parties must take reasonable steps to ensure that LEP persons have meaningful access to the programs (70 Fed. Reg. at 74087 to 74100).
- L. Title IX of the Education Amendments of 1972, as amended, which prohibits the parties from discriminating because of sex in education programs or activities (20 U.S.C. 1681 et seq.).

27. Disadvantaged Business Enterprise (DBE) Program Requirements If federal funds are used:

- A. The parties shall comply with the Disadvantaged Business Enterprise Program requirements established in 49 CFR Part 26.
- B. The Local Government shall adopt, in its totality, the State's federally approved DBE program.
- C. The Local Government shall incorporate into its contracts with subproviders an appropriate DBE goal consistent with the State's DBE guidelines and in consideration of the local market, project size, and nature of the goods or services to be acquired. The Local Government shall submit its proposed scope of services and quantity estimates to the State to allow the State to establish a DBE goal for each Local Government contract with a subprovider. The Local Government shall be responsible for documenting its actions.
- D. The Local Government shall follow all other parts of the State's DBE program referenced in TxDOT Form 2395, Memorandum of Understanding Regarding the Adoption of the Texas Department of Transportation's Federally-Approved Disadvantaged Business Enterprise by Entity, and attachments found at web address http://ftp.dot.state.tx.us/pub/txdot-info/bop/dbe/mou/mou_attachments.pdf.
- E. The Local Government shall not discriminate on the basis of race, color, national origin, or sex in the award and performance of any U.S. Department of Transportation (DOT)-assisted contract or in the administration of its DBE program or the requirements of 49 CFR Part 26. The Local Government shall take all necessary and reasonable steps under 49 CFR Part 26 to ensure non-discrimination in award and administration of DOT-assisted contracts. The State's DBE program, as required by 49 CFR Part 26 and as approved by DOT, is incorporated by reference in this Agreement. Implementation of this program is a legal obligation and failure to carry out its terms shall be treated as a violation of this Agreement. Upon notification to the Local Government of its failure to carry out its approved program, the State may impose sanctions as provided for under 49 CFR Part 26 and may, in appropriate cases, refer the matter for enforcement under 18 U.S.C. 1001 and the Program Fraud Civil Remedies Act of 1986 (31 U.S.C. 3801 et seq.).
- F. Each contract the Local Government signs with a contractor (and each subcontract the prime contractor signs with a sub-contractor) must include the following assurance:

 The contractor, sub-recipient, or sub-contractor shall not discriminate on the basis of race, color, national origin, or sex in the performance of this contract. The contractor shall carry out applicable requirements of 49 CFR Part 26 in the award and administration of DOT-assisted contracts. Failure by the contractor to carry out these

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requirements is a material breach of this Agreement, which may result in the termination of this Agreement or such other remedy as the recipient deems appropriate.

28. Debarment Certifications

If federal funds are used, the parties are prohibited from making any award at any tier to any party that is debarred or suspended or otherwise excluded from or ineligible for participation in Federal Assistance Programs under Executive Order 12549, "Debarment and Suspension." By executing this Agreement, the Local Government certifies that it and its principals are not currently debarred, suspended, or otherwise excluded from or ineligible for participation in Federal Assistance Programs under Executive Order 12549 and further certifies that it will not do business with any party, to include principals, that is currently debarred, suspended, or otherwise excluded from or ineligible for participation in Federal Assistance Programs under Executive Order 12549. The parties to this Agreement shall require any party to a subcontract or purchase order awarded under this Agreement to certify its eligibility to receive federal funds and, when requested by the State, to furnish a copy of the certification.

If state funds are used, the parties are prohibited from making any award to any party that is debarred under the Texas Administrative Code, Title 34, Part 1, Chapter 20, Subchapter G, Rule §20.585 and the Texas Administrative Code, Title 43, Part 1, Chapter 9, Subchapter G.

29. Lobbying Certification

If federal funds are used, in executing this Agreement, each signatory certifies to the best of that signatory's knowledge and belief, that:

- A. No federal appropriated funds have been paid or will be paid by or on behalf of the parties to any person for influencing or attempting to influence an officer or employee of any federal agency, a Member of Congress, an officer or employee of Congress, or an employee of a Member of Congress in connection with the awarding of any federal contract, the making of any federal grant, the making of any federal loan, the entering into of any cooperative agreement, and the extension, continuation, renewal, amendment, or modification of any federal contract, grant, loan, or cooperative agreement.
- B. If any funds other than federal appropriated funds have been paid or will be paid to any person for influencing or attempting to influence an officer or employee of any agency, a Member of Congress, an officer or employee of Congress, or an employee of a Member of Congress in connection with federal contracts, grants, loans, or cooperative agreements, the signatory for the Local Government shall complete and submit the Federal Standard Form-LLL, "Disclosure Form to Report Lobbying," in accordance with its instructions.
- C. The parties shall require that the language of this certification shall be included in the award documents for all sub-awards at all tiers (including subcontracts, subgrants, and contracts under grants, loans, and cooperative agreements) and all sub-recipients shall certify and disclose accordingly. Submission of this certification is a prerequisite for making or entering into this transaction imposed by Title 31 U.S.C. §1352. Any person who fails to file the required certification shall be subject to a civil penalty of not less than \$10,000 and not more than \$100,000 for each such failure.

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30. Federal Funding Accountability and Transparency Act Requirements

If federal funds are used, the following requirements apply:

- A. Any recipient of funds under this Agreement agrees to comply with the Federal Funding Accountability and Transparency Act (FFATA) and implementing regulations at 2 CFR Part 170, including Appendix A. This Agreement is subject to the following award terms: http://www.gpo.gov/fdsys/pkg/FR-2010-09-14/pdf/2010-22705.pdf and http://www.gpo.gov/fdsys/pkg/FR-2010-09-14/pdf/2010-22706.pdf.
- B. The Local Government agrees that it shall:
 - 1. Obtain and provide to the State a System for Award Management (SAM) number (Federal Acquisition Regulation, Part 4, Sub-part 4.11) if this award provides more than \$25,000 in federal funding. - D. For each year the Project remains open for federal funding expenditures, the Local Government will be responsible for filing a report or statement as described above. Since February 28, 2007, the Fort Worth District of Texas Department of Transportation has been responsible for the cleanup of approximately 102.24 acres of roadside property within the City of Grand Prairie, along access state routes of State Hwy 360 N (from Avenue K North to the Fort Worth border), IH 30, and IH 20. The frequency with which TxDOT has been able to maintain these roadside acres is insufficient to provide for the cleanliness desired by the City. Amendment #1 to the Municipal Maintenance Agreement will allow the City to contract with a vendor to collect litter and conduct mowing along these roadways and provides for reimbursement to the City from the state for up to \$13.56 per acre per collection cycle, up to 12 events per year for the 5-year period and \$46.65 per acre per mowing cycle, up to three (3) events per year for the 5-year period. This amendment will allow the coordination of litter and mowing cycles to reduce the chance of mowing taking place before the litter has been picked up.

Council approved a similar amendment on February 18, 2020. However, prior to that agreement being signed by both parties, Fort Worth TxDOT agreed to reimburse for mowing as well. This agreement reflects the

addition of mowing reimbursements.

Financial Consideration

The actual cost of mowing along these roadways at a frequency of once per month is \$23,847.50 of which approximately \$14,308.50 is eligible for reimbursement annually from TxDOT under this agreement. If more frequent mowing is needed, the expense associated with this will be paid for by the City.

Funding is available in the approved FY 2019/2020 Code Compliance Budget 283310 61225 Contractual Services.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF GRAND PRAIRIE, TEXAS THAT:

SECTION 1. In consideration of the premises and mutual covenants and agreements of the parties hereto to be by them respectively kept and performed, as hereinafter set forth, the City and State do mutually agree to the amendment as follows:

SECTION 2. State's Responsibilities

1. Reimburse the City for cleaning up litter within the outermost curbs of the frontage roads or the entire right-of-way line and the outermost curb or crown-line of the frontage road in undeveloped areas. Reimbursement shall be limited to twelve litter collections per year for a five-year commitment. The rate of reimbursement shall be based on the average 2019 litter

- clean-up costs for Tarrant County. The average cost for litter cleanup is \$13.56/acre. Reimbursement may be further limited if the State adopts a statewide policy reducing the number of cycles to less than twelve per year.
- 2. Reimburse the City for full width mowing within the outermost curbs of the frontage roads or the entire right-of-way line and the outermost curb or crown-line of the frontage road in undeveloped areas. Reimbursement shall be limited to up to three (3) mowing cycles a year for a minimum of a five (5) year commitment. The rate of reimbursement shall be based on the full width mowing cost for Tarrant County. The 2019 rate for full width mowing is \$46.65/acre. Reimbursement may be further limited if the State adopts a statewide policy reducing the number of cycles to less than three (3) per year.

If there is a State policy change to further reduce the State's mowing or litter cycles, the State shall notify the City, in writing, within sixty (60) days of this change. If the State fails to notify the City as required under this paragraph, the State shall be responsible for payments to the City in accordance with the previously agreed upon reimbursement schedule.

City's Responsibilities (Controlled Access)

- 1. Perform full width mowing and litter control at the locations indicated as follows:
- Controlled access state routes of IH0360 N (from Avenue K north to the Fort Worth border) 50.01 acres, IH0030 .57 acres, and IH0020 42.87 acres for 93.45 total acres within the City.
- Clean up litter and perform full width mowing within the outermost curbs of the frontage roads or the entire right-of-way width where no frontage roads exist, and between the right-of-way line and the outermost curb or crown-line of the frontage roads in undeveloped areas for a minimum of five (5) years.
- 2. Submit invoices and cancelled checks for mowing and litter cleanup cycles at intervals as established as above.
- 3. Reimbursement will not be made for litter pick up if the roadway is under construction or if it is taken off the state system.
- The City agrees that for mowing and litter cleanup, if performed by employees of the City, the City shall show proof of self-insurance. If mowing and litter cleanup is performed by a contractor(s) selected by the City through its selection process; the City shall require the contractor(s) to have in place, insurance as evidenced by the State's Certificate of Insurance form. The city will also require any contractor(s) to agree to indemnify and save harmless the state from all claims and liability due to the contractor(s) materials or activities of itself, its agent, or employees, performed under the agreement with the city that are caused or may result from error, omission, or negligent act. Prior to any mowing or litter cleanup by the City, such evidence of self-insurance or certificate of insurance shall be provided to the State.

Termination

This Amendment is expressly made subject to the rights of TxDOT or the City to terminate this Amendment without cause or liability, excluding liability for services rendered prior to the date of termination, upon providing written notice to the other party. Except as otherwise provided in

this paragraph or mutually agreed by the parties, termination without cause shall be effective thirty (30) days after the non-terminating party's receipt of written notice. TxDOT or the City may terminate this Amendment upon notice at any time for a violation of the terms of this Amendment. The termination of this Amendment does not affect any other provisions of the existing Municipal Maintenance Agreement between the parties. If the City has entered into a contract with a third party to perform any service under this Amendment, the Amendment will continue in effect until the current term of the contract has expired.

In all other respects, the Agreement shall remain in force and effect without change.

SECTION 3. The City Manager is hereby authorized to enter into a contract to effectuate the intent of the outlined amendment.

AGREEMENT

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the premises and mutual covenants and agreements of the parties hereto to be by them respectively kept and performed, as hereinafter set forth, the City and State do mutually agree to the amendment as follows:

State's Responsibilities

- 1. Reimburse the City for cleaning up litter within the outermost curbs of the frontage roads or the entire right-of-way line and the outermost curb or crown line of the frontage roads in undeveloped areas. Reimbursement shall be limited to 12 litter collections per year for a five-year commitment. The rate of reimbursement shall be based on the average 2019 litter clean- up costs for Tarrant County. The average cost for litter clean-up is \$13.56/ acre. Reimbursement may be further limited if the State adopts a statewide policy reducing the number of litter cycles to less than twelve per year.
- 2. Reimburse the City for full width mowing within the outermost curbs of the frontage roads or the entire right-of-way line and the outermost curb or crown line of the frontage roads in undeveloped areas. Reimbursement shall be limited to three (3) mowing cycles a year for a minimum of a five (5) year commitment.

Since September 6, 1994 the Dallas District of Texas Department of Transportation has been responsible for the cleanup and mowing of approximately 296.64347 acres of roadside property within the City of Grand Prairie, along access state routes of IH 20 (Controlled Access from the East City Limit to the West City Limit) 114.427 acres and IH 30 (Controlled Access from the East City Limit to the West City Limit) 145.618 acres. The frequency with which TxDOT has been able to maintain these roadside acres is insufficient to provide for the cleanliness desired by the City. Amendment #1 to the Municipal Maintenance Agreement will allow the City to contract with a vendor to collect litter and conduct mowing along these roadways and provides for reimbursement to the City from the state for up to \$15.15 per acre per collection cycle, up to 12 events per year for the 5-year period and \$55.00 per acre, limited to three (3) per year for the 5-year period. This amendment will allow the coordination of litter and mowing cycles to reduce the chance of mowing taking place before litter has been picked up.

Council approved a similar amendment with regard to litter only on February 18, 2020. However, prior to that

agreement being signed by both parties, Dallas TxDOT agreed to reimburse for mowing as well. This agreement reflects the addition of mowing reimbursements.

Financial Consideration

The total cost of mowing along these roadways at a frequency of once per month is \$81,576.95 of which approximately \$48,946.17 is eligible for reimbursement annually from TxDOT under this agreement. If more frequent mowing is needed, the expense associated with this will be paid for by the City.

Funding is available in the approved FY 2019/2020 Code Compliance Budget 283310 61225 Contractual Services.

Reimbursement shall be limited to 3 mowing cycles per year (in approximately May, August and November) The rate of reimbursement shall be up to current contract prices for mowing and litter costs for Dallas County. Reimbursement for mowing will be \$55/acre.

Reimbursement shall be limited to up to 12 litter cycles per year (on a monthly basis). The rate of reimbursement shall be up to current contract prices for litter costs for Dallas County. The current contract price is \$15.15/acre for litter clean up.

Reimbursement may be further limited if the State adopts a statewide policy reducing the number of mowing cycles to less than three per year or the number of litter cycles to less than 12 per year.

At the end of the third year, the State will re-evaluate the current prices for both mowing and litter clean up and enter into a new agreement with the City.

SUMMARY:

Site Plan for Hunter Ferrell Logistics Park, a development with two warehouse buildings totaling 550,518 sq. ft. on 33.44 acres. Tracts 14.2 and 27, Isreal Jennings Survey, Abstract No. 679, City of Grand Prairie, Dallas County, Texas, zoned Light Industrial, and addressed as 2400 and 2701 W Hunter Ferrell Rd.

PURPOSE OF REQUEST:

The applicant intends to construct two warehouse buildings on 33 acres. Site Plan approval by City Council is required for any project involving industrial use. Development at this location requires City Council approval of a Site Plan because the property is intended for industrial use.

The purpose of site plan approval is to ensure that development meets requirements in the Unified Development Code (UDC), provides adequate circulation, and uses quality site planning techniques. The UDC identifies criteria for evaluating proposed developments. Criteria include density and dimensional standards, landscaping and screening requirements, and architectural design for special districts.

ADJACENT LAND USES:

The following table summarizes the zoning designation and existing use for the surrounding properties.

PROPOSED USE CHARACTERISTICS AND FUNCTION:

The applicant is proposing two development scenarios: the construction of Building A on 13.2 acres or the construction of Building A and Building B on 33 acres.

Building A Site Plan

The 13.2-acre site is accessible by two points on W Hunter Ferrell Rd. The proposed warehouse building is 252,919 sq. ft. and has a loading dock on the south side of the building with 54 dock doors. The site includes 160 parking spaces and 60 trailer parking spaces.

Building B Site Plan

The 19.82-acre site is accessible from W Hunter Ferrell Rd via a shared drive. The proposed warehouse building is 166,642 sq. ft. and has a loading dock on the north side of the building with 31 dock doors. The site includes 159 parking spaces and 50 trailer parking spaces.

Site Access and Traffic Impact

The right-of-way for Hunter Ferrell Rd is within the City of Irving. This means that driveway widths and spacing, median openings, deceleration lanes, and pedestrian/bicycle facilities must be approved by the City of Irving. The proposed access points do not align with existing median openings; any median modifications must also be approved by the City of Irving.

ZONING REQUIREMENTS:

Density and Dimensional Requirements

Development is subject to the LI standards in the UDC. The tables below evaluate the density and dimensional standards of the proposed development. The proposal meets the density and dimensional requirements with the exception of minimum lot width for Site B.

VARIANCES:

City Council may approve variances to Appendix X if the applicant demonstrates that the proposal meets the intent of the ordinance and that the alternative design or measure provides an equal or greater level of quality and standard of development as mandated by the regulations. As a part of this Site Plan, the applicant is requesting the variances listed below.

- 1. Truck Docks Location for Building B Truck docks are prohibited along any primary facade.
- 2. <u>Tree Preservation Requirements</u> Appendix X requires that developers submit a tree survey and preserves a minimum of 30% of the total existing caliper inches. The applicant has not submitted a tree survey.



3. Minimum Lot Width for Site B - Site B does not meet the minimum required lot width.

RECOMMENDATION:

The Development Review Committee (DRC) recommends approval with the following conditions:

- 1. The applicant shall coordinate with the Parks Department to connect the proposed walking trails to the existing trail west of the property. The applicant shall construct this connection in conjunction with the proposed trail and activation feature.
- 2. The applicant shall provide an additional row of street trees closer to Hunter Ferrell Rd to create shade along the existing trail. These trees will count towards the required number of trees. The proposed number of trees is 28 less than what is required. The applicant shall coordinate with the Parks Department and City of Irving on the placement of trees along the trail.

The site shall provide 1.5 acres of open space, with 1,452 linear sq. ft. of walking trails with 24 seats and 9,112 sq. ft. of garden space.

Industrial buildings greater than 50,000 sq. ft. are subject to the requirements in Appendix X of the UDC. Appendix X requires that primary facades include at least three design elements and secondary facades include at least two design elements. Both buildings A&B consists of 100% exterior masonry construction utilizing textured concrete tilt-wall panels of varying finishes and colors in compliance with required architectural articulation requirements. The construction styles consist of two accent materials along the vertical surface. 18" Cornice projection shall extend along the entire length of the primary facades. The primary facade shall provide accent lighting minimum 50% of its length.




ZONING DISTRICTS MAP

Read Survey, Abstract 1183, City of Grand Prairie, Dallas County, Texas, zoned Light Industrial (LI) District, within the SH-161 Corridor Overlay District, generally located southeast of SH 161 Service Road and W. Hardrock Road, and addressed as 3545 Hardrock Road, Grand Prairie, Texas. <u>PUBLIC HEARING AGENDA Item #3 – SU200603 - Specific Use Permit - Camp Wisdom Plaza (Commissioner Connor/City Council District 4).</u> Chief City Planner Savannah Ware presented the case report and gave a Power Point presentation a Specific Use Permit for Beer/Wine Sales in a proposed Convenience Store with Gasoline Sales. A portion of Tracts 2C05 and 2C05A, John W Harwood Survey, Abstract No. 661, City of Grand Prairie, Tarrant County, Texas, zoned PD-130, and generally located at the northwest corner of W Camp Wisdom Rd and Lynn Rd. The applicant is Houshang Jahuani, Jahani Consulting Engineers Inc., and the owner is Anil Pathak.

Ms. Ware stated this request is for a Specific Use Permit to allow Beer/Wine Sales in a proposed Convenience Store. PD-130 states that additional uses shall be allow, as prescribed in Section B-100 of the Comprehensive Zoning Ordinance for the General Retail District, upon approval of a Specific Use Permit. Section B-100 shows that the Sale of Alcoholic Beverages for Off-Premise Consumption requires a Specific Use Permit. The purpose of the Specific Use Permit process is to identify those uses which might be appropriate within a zoning district, but due to either their location, functional or operational nature, could have potentially negative impact upon surrounding properties; and to provide for a procedure whereby such uses might be permitted by further restricting or conditioning them so as to eliminate such probable negative impacts. Residents from the adjacent neighborhood raised concerns about traffic, noise, and lighting during the Planning and Zoning Commission meeting and City Council meeting for Case Number S200101. Approval of this Specific Use Permit will increase the items available for purchase at the proposed Convenience Store. This could increase the number of trips generated by the Convenience Store and increase the negative impacts generated by this use. City Council may establish conditions of operation, location, arrangement and construction of any authorized special use. City Council may impose such development standards and safeguards as conditions warrant for the welfare and protection of adjacent properties and citizenry. Given the proximity of this location to an existing neighborhood, citizens' concerns about traffic, noise, and lighting, and the possibility that adding this use could exacerbate potential negative impacts of the proposed development, staff recommends the following conditions:

- The applicant shall construct the required masonry screening wall with Phase 1;
- The masonry screening wall shall be a minimum of eight feet in height;
- The applicant shall provide a landscape buffer along the screening wall that is at least 15 feet wide: and
- The applicant shall plant native shade trees, a minimum of three inches in caliper, every 15 feet in the landscape buffer.

Commissioner Moser stated the convenience store is a permitted use by right the request is for an SUP to be able to sell beer and wine. He stated he read the emails in opposition to this case, but this case is not for the sales of liquor.

Commissioner Smith stated the use is allow by right and the site plan was approved back in January for a convenience store, what concerns her is the adjacent neighbors having to look at a screening wall behind their homes. Ms. Ware stated the screening wall would need to be place on the property line with an additional landscaping buffer.

Commissioner Smith asked if there were any meetings held with the developer and property owners.

Vice-Chairperson Shawn Connor stated there were no more questions for staff, opened the public hearing, and called for individuals wishing to speak on this item. At this time, Vice-Chairperson Connor read the names of individuals in opposition to this case:

Eric & Shawna Anderson, Brenda Rogers, Chris Brown, David Gerber, Philip Peacock, Rashida Beaseley, Taneka Brown, Terry Osmun, Jill Buchanan, Duane Shorter

Andrew Ruegg and Dallas Cothrum with Masterplan a Land Use Consultant, 2201 Main Street, Suite 1280, Dallas, TX were present representing the case. Mr. Cothrum gave a presentation and stated they would reduce the hours of operation to 6am to 12am and would be constructing an 8ft masonry wall with additional landscaping as screening. He stated the operation could run effectively at this location.

Vice-Chairperson Connor asked if they had met with the adjacent homeowners. Mr. Cothrum replied no, not an actual meeting, but did speak with some homeowners and the HOA.

Commissioner Coleman asked if there would be a drive though window. Mr. Cothrum replied no, there would be no drive through window all sales would be conduct in side.

Commissioner Smith stated, as a good neighbor they should meet with the HOA, because citizens are the ones that live next to this development.

Commissioner Perez asked if the beer and wine sales are not allow would the hours of operation change. Mr. Cothrum replied no.

Scott and Sharon Whittaker, 2741 White Oak Drive, Grand Prairie, TX stated they have lived in this neighborhood for the past 33 years and they do not have an HOA. This neighborhood has younger families with children and having beer and wine at this location is not a good idea. She

stated there would be a lot of traffic coming and going into their neighborhood. They do not want to see trash, nor do they want their property values to increase.

Commissioner Moser stated he understands Ms. Whittaker, but this will be a convenience store even if this SUP is not approve.

Bob Rein, 2716 White Oak Drive, Grand Prairie, TX, stated he is in strong opposition to this request.

Lori Rein, 2716 White Oak Drive, Grand Prairie, TX, asked that the SUP be deny.

Christian Brown, 5120 Garden Oaks Place, Grand Prairie, TX, stated he understands they have a right to go in, but he strongly opposes the beer and wine sale.

Victoria Hess, 2721 White Oak Drive, Grand Prairie, TX, stated she would like to thank her neighbors for rallying in January when the site plan came before the commission. She stated there are plenty of beer and wine sales in the area.

Commissioner Smith stated she like to thank Victoria Hess for coming to the meeting and speaking out.

David Gerber, 5128 Garden Oaks Place, Grand Prairie, TX stated he is good with the store, but not the beer and wine sales.

Jeff Hess, 2721 White Oak Drive, Grand Prairie, TX, asked if they are approve for 12 midnight, and decide to change their hours, could they do that. Ms. Ware stated the hours of operation would be noted the ordinance and if they do not comply, they could lose their SUP.

Dallas Cothrum stepped forward for a rebuttal. He stated they would only have one vendor and would be making one delivery trip a week. If they wish, they could limit the beer and wine advertisement.

There being no further discussion on the case commissioner Smith moved to close the public hearing and deny case SU200602/S200602. The motion failed in lack of a second.

Commissioner Coleman moved to close the public hearing and approve case SU200602/S200602 per staff's recommendations and the hours of operation to be from 6am to 12am.

PLANNING AND ZONING COMMISSION MINUTES, JUNE 22, 2020

Commissioner Moser stated he would like to make sure the citizens understand that the Planning Commission is a recommending body and this case would be forward to the city council for final consideration, and could over rule their recommendation.

WHEREAS, after consideration of said application, the Planning and Zoning Commission of the City of Grand Prairie, Texas voted 6 to 1 to recommend to the City Council of Grand Prairie, Texas, that said Zoning Ordinance and Map be amended to allow a Specific Use Permit for Sale of Alcoholic Beverages for Off-Premise Consumption in a proposed Convenience Store; and

WHEREAS, Notice was given of a further public hearing to be held by the City Council of the City of Grand Prairie, Texas, in the City Hall Plaza Building at 6:30 o'clock P.M. on July 14, 2020, to consider the advisability of amending the Zoning Ordinance and Map as recommended by the Planning and Zoning Commission, and all citizens and parties at

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interest were notified that they would have an opportunity to be heard, such Notice of the time and place of such hearing having been given at least fifteen (15) days prior to such hearing by publication in the, Fort Worth Star Telegram, Fort Worth, Texas, a newspaper of general circulation in such municipality; and

WHEREAS, all citizens and parties at interest have been given an opportunity to be heard on all the matter of the Specific Use Permit and the City Council of the City of Grand Prairie, Texas, being informed as to the location and nature of the specific use proposed on said property, as well as the nature and usability of surrounding property, have found and determined that the property in question, as well as other property within the city limits of the City of Grand Prairie, Texas, has changed in character since the enactment of the original Zoning Ordinance to the extent that a specific use may be made of said property as herein provided and by reason of changed conditions, does consider and find that this amendatory Ordinance should be enacted since its provisions are in the public interest and will promote the health, safety and welfare of the community.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF GRAND PRAIRIE, TEXAS:

SECTION 1. That Ordinance Number 4779, being the Unified Development Code of the City of Grand Prairie, Texas, showing the locations and boundaries of certain districts, and said Zoning Ordinance and Map having been made a part of an Ordinance entitled:

"THE UNIFIED DEVELOPMENT CODE OF THE CITY OF GRAND PRAIRIE, TEXAS, AS PASSED AND APPROVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL ON THE 20TH DAY OF NOVEMBER, 1990, TOGETHER WITH ALL AMENDMENTS THERETO AND ENACTING A REVISED ORDINANCE ESTABLISHING AND PROVIDING FOR ZONING REGULATIONS; CREATING USE DISTRICTS IN ACCORDANCE WITH A COMPREHENSIVE PLAN..."

passed and approved November 20, 1990, as amended, is hereby further amended so as to establish a Specific Use Permit for Sale of Alcoholic Beverages for Off-Premise Consumption in a proposed Convenience Store on a portion of Tracts 2C05 and 2C05A, John W Harwood Survey, Abstract No. 661, City of Grand Prairie, Tarrant County, Texas, as depicted in Exhibit A - Boundary Description, attached hereto.

SECTION 2. That the purpose of this Ordinance is to provide the appropriate restrictions and development controls that ensure this Specific Use Permit is compatible with the surrounding development and zoning and to also ensure that the development complies with the City's Comprehensive Plan and Unified Development Code.

SECTION 3. That for operations of Sale of Alcoholic Beverages for Off-Premise Consumption in a proposed Convenience Store, the following standards and conditions are hereby established as part of this ordinance:

- 1. The applicant shall construct the required masonry screening wall with Phase 1;
- 2. The masonry screening wall shall be a minimum of eight feet in height;
- 3. The applicant shall provide a landscape buffer along the screening wall that is at least 15 feet wide;
- 4. The applicant shall plant native shade trees, a minimum of three inches in caliper, every 15 feet in the landscape buffer; and
- 5. The hours of operation of the Convenience Store with Sale of Alcoholic Beverages for Off-Premise Consumption shall not extend past 6:00 AM and midnight.
- 6. No later than 12 months following the issuance of a Certificate of Occupancy, the Specific Use Permit for Sale of Alcoholic Beverages for Off-Premise Consumption in a proposed Convenience Store will be brought back to Council for review. Any violation to this SUP or the Grand Prairie Code of Ordinances prior to this date will be grounds for City staff to introduce revocation proceedings against the Specific Use Permit established by this ordinance.

SECTION 4. That the operations of Sale of Alcoholic Beverages for Off-Premise Consumption in a proposed Convenience Store shall comply with the following:

- 1. By this Ordinance, this Specific Use Permit shall automatically terminate in accordance with Section 5.4.1 of the Unified Development Code if a Certificate of Occupancy is not issued for said use within one (1) year after City Council adoption of this Ordinance, or upon cessation of said use for a period of six (6) months or more.
- 2. It shall be unlawful for the owner, manager, or any person in charge of a business or other establishment to violate the conditions imposed by the City Council when a Specific Use Permit is granted, and the violation of those conditions could result in a citation being issued by the appropriate enforcement officers of the City of Grand Prairie. Violation of this provision may be punishable in accordance with Section 1-8 of the Code of Ordinances of the City.
- 3. This Specific Use Permit shall run with the land and therefore may be transferred from owner to owner; however, each new owner shall obtain a new Certificate of Occupancy.
- 4. The Certificate of Occupancy shall note the existence of this Specific Use Permit by its number and title.
- 5. The operation of the facility shall be in strict compliance with all requirements of the Environmental Services Department, Building Inspections, Police Department and Fire Administration.
- 6. Any unsafe or unauthorized operations or activities may be determined as grounds for revocation of the Specific Use Permit by the City Council.

SECTION 5. That it is further provided that in the case a section, clause, sentence or part of this Ordinance shall be deemed or adjudicated by a court of competent jurisdiction to be invalid, then such invalidity shall not affect, impair or invalidate the remainder of this Ordinance.

SECTION 6. That a violation of this Ordinance is a misdemeanor punishable in accordance with Section 1-8 of the Code of Ordinances of the City of Grand Prairie, Texas. The penalty provided herein shall be cumulative of other remedies provided by State law, and the power of injunction as provided in Texas Local Government Code Section 54.016, as amended, may be exercised in enforcing this ordinance whether or not there has been a complaint filed.

SECTION 7. That the Unified Development Code of the City of Grand Prairie, as amended, shall be and remain in full force and effect save and except as amended by this Ordinance.

SECTION 8. That the terms and provisions of this Ordinance are severable and are governed by Section 1-4 of the Code of Ordinances of the City of Grand Prairie, Texas.

SECTION 9. That all ordinances or parts of ordinances in conflict herewith are specifically repealed.

SECTION 10. That this Ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage and approval.



SUMMARY:

Consideration of a request granting a variance to authorize the sale of alcoholic beverages on Lot 1R, Block A, Epic West Towne Crossing Phase 1, located at 3148 South State Highway 161 Suite 400, zoned "PD-364" Planned Development 364 District for on-premise consumption within three-hundred (300) feet of Moore Elementary School, a public education institution located in Council District 2. The applicant is Warren Cohen.

BACKGROUND INFORMATION:

Title 4, Chapter 109, Subchapter B, §109.33(e) authorizes municipalities to establish a variance process if it is determined that the enforcement of the regulation in a particular instance is not in the best interest of the public,

constitutes waste or inefficient use of land or other resources, creates an undue hardship on an applicant for a license or permit, does not serve its intended purpose, is not effective or necessary, or for any other reason the city council, after consideration of the health, safety, and welfare of the public and the equities of the situation, determines is in the best interest of the community.

The applicant is seeking their first alcohol permit for Blaze Fast Fire'd Pizza that will be located in the Epic West Town Crossing shopping center. Alcohol has not previously been sold at this location and the applicant intends to sell beer and wine, for on-premise consumption. Currently, the sale of alcoholic beverages at the subject property will violate Title 4, Chapter 109, Subchapter B, §109.33(a)(1) of the Texas Alcoholic Beverage Code. The applicant is requesting a variance to allow the off-premise sale of alcohol within three hundred (300) feet of Moore Elementary School, which is accredited and recognized by the Texas Commission of Education. The Blaze Fast Fire'd Pizza and the school share a property line to the east.

ALTERNATIVES:

The City may opt not to grant the requested variance, prohibiting the sale of alcohol for on-premise consumption at Blaze Fast Fire'd Pizza, 3148 South State Highway 161 Suite 400.

STAFF ANALYSIS:

The analysis includes the following findings and factors:

- 1. The distance from the parcel of which the convenience store will be located.
- 2. The sale of alcohol is for on-premise consumption only.

Should City Council choose to waive the distance requirement provision, staff recommends the following conditions:

- 1) That the sale of alcoholic beverages be limited to Blaze Fast Fire'd Pizza.
- 2) Alcohol sales will include beer and wine for on-premises consumption only.
- 3) That the authorization for the sale of alcoholic beverages shall not transfer to different land uses or owners.
- 4) That such authorization shall terminate in the event of non-operation or non-use of the identified establishments for a period of twelve (12) or more successive months.
- 5) The hours of operation shall be limited to Everyday from 11am-11pm.
- 6) The sale of alcohol equal to or exceeding 75% alcohol sales will require a Specific Use Permit.
